



SYRACUSE & THE UNDERGROUND RAILROAD

Syracuse had long been a hub of anti-slavery activity. The "Underground Railroad," a network of safe houses and routes from points in the southern United States to the country's northern borders, was used during the 1800s to get runaway slaves to freedom in free states and Canada. Curator of history for the Onondaga Historical Association, Robert Searing, says Syracuse became the "great central depot" of the Underground Railroad. On Oct. 1, 1851, an escaped slave named William Henry, who was known as Jerry, was seized for a hearing by five U.S. marshals near the Erie Canal at the southeast corner of what is now Clinton and Water streets. After a failed escape attempt, Jerry was moved to the police station. Jermaine Loguen and Samuel May, both ministers, formed a plan to help Jerry. A large crowd visiting the city for an anti-slavery convention gathered in front of the building where Jerry was being held. Upon a signal from the leaders, the crowd broke into the jail, freed Jerry, and helped him escape to Canada. A monument was added to downtown Syracuse's Clinton Square in 1990 to commemorate the event that became known as the Jerry Rescue. Source: NationalGeographic.com.





SPORTS FACILITIES

Central New Yorkers love their sports, from trekking up to the hill for Syracuse University games inside the Dome, to Saturday morning youth hockey games at city ice rinks. The pandemic may have impacted some seasons, but the passion and history of sports here will help it all return with vigor. In the meantime, there are plenty of safe ways to stay active. Take a hike or play a round of golf, rack up your bike or go for a jog — the trails, greens and paths are calling! Professional teams include the Syracuse Mets* the AAA affiliate team of MLB **New York** Mets. Their stadium, on the northside of Syracuse, is undergoing a two-year \$25 million renovation that includes new seats, LED lighting, new playing surface and a party deck along the outfield fence. The Syracuse Crunch* (AHL) are affiliated with the NHL Tampa Bay Lightning.

Collegiate athletic teams include the Division I Syracuse University* men's football, basketball (2003 NCAA Champions), and lacrosse teams with more than 10 national championships. Both the men's and women's basketball teams made it to the 2016 Final Four. The Orange women advanced to the championship game, but lost to the University of Connecticut, which won its fourth straight national title thanks to CNY native Breanna Stewart. The women's field hockey and men's cross-country teams at Syracuse University earned national titles in 2015. Le Moyne College* and Onondaga Community College* also boast national titles in baseball, basketball, lacrosse and volleyball. In addition, the greater region is home to national champions including: Clarkson University's women's ice hockey team (2014 National Collegiate champion); SUNY Cortland's* men's soccer team won the 2016 State University of New York Athletic Conference Championship; and the Cornell University's* men's and women's ice hockey teams frequently dominate the ECAC and Ivy League championships with wins for the men in 2018, 2019 and 2020 and the women in 2017, 2018 and 2020.

ONONDAGA CREEKWALK

Winding its way through the city of Syracuse is the Onondaga Creekwalk — a 4.8-mile, 13-foot-wide trail that is ideal for walking, running or biking. The Creekwalk nearly doubled in length in the summer of 2020 with a new 2.2-mile section connecting Kirk Park to Armory Square. The trail is marked with a painted yellow line, lights, benches, bike-friendly traffic signals and emergency call boxes. Users can now walk, run or ride from the South Side of Syracuse all the way to Onondaga Lake near Destiny USA. Despite the pandemic, one project that continued and made great progress in 2020 was the Empire State Trail through Syracuse and its suburbs. The Empire State Trail is a \$200 million project that will connect Albany with Buffalo via the Erie Canalway Trail. A significant portion of the trail was completed in Central New York in 2020 along Erie Boulevard in DeWitt into the city of Syracuse. BREWERIES

Syracuse has a long and storied brewing history. Centrally located in the state, with rail lines and the Erie Canal nearby, Syracuse was a perfect place to brew and distribute beer during the 1800s. Brewery business peaked during the 1890s when the brewing industry employed 400 people locally and produced about 300,000 barrels of beer and ale each year, according to the Onondaga Historical Association. Prohibition all but wiped out the industry before it began to re-emerge in 1994 when the microbrewery trend began to sweep across the country, including here in Central New York, which is now home to more than a dozen microbreweries.

South







How to register a child for public school

Many school districts offer registration instructions, forms and information on their websites or you can call the district's main office for instructions. You will likely need proof of address in your school district. If your child is new to school (kindergarten or pre-K), you will likely be required to present a birth certificate, immunization record and a report of a physical exam. If the child is transferring from another school, you may be asked to bring a report card or other transfer paperwork from your child's last school. The school may also ask for an immunization record and a physical exam report.





QUALITY HEALTH CARE IS THE CORE OF OUR COMMUNITY

The Syracuse metropolitan area is home to more than 1,600 hospital beds at four large health care organizations: Crouse Health, St. Joseph's Health, Upstate University Hospital/ Upstate Medical University, and the Syracuse VA Medical Center. It also includes more than 2,000 general and specialty practicing physicians, 11 nursing homes, several ambulatory care facilities and a patientcentered medical home.

Crouse Health is a top 10 area employer, with 3,200 employees and a medical staff of more than 900 physicians. Crouse is Central New York's largest provider of maternity care services and is the designated regional referral center for high-risk neonatal intensive care (NICU) services. Other areas of specialty include comprehensive adult and pediatric diagnostic and interventional cardiac care (Crouse is home to CNY's only pediatric cardiac catheterization program); internal medicine; surgical services (including the latest advancements in bariatric, GYN oncology and robotic surgery); stroke care/neurosciences (Crouse is a NYS-designated Comprehensive Stroke Center); orthopedics; and the region's only hospital-based addiction treatment services for adults, adolescents and seniors.

St. Joseph's Health is ranked among the top 15 heart surgery centers in the country by Consumer Reports, a designated Stroke Center and a U.S. News "Best Regional Hospital." It also supports major programs in vascular surgery, women's health, ENT and orthopedics. St. Joseph's is the only magnet-designated hospital in the region, recognized for nursing excellence, and the only Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grade 'A' recipient in Central New York. Offering Primary and Specialty Care services across a 16-county region, St. Joseph's Health celebrated the 50th anniversary of its NICU in 2020. The level III NICU was the first in the region when it opened in 1970.

Crouse Health and **St. Joseph's Health** operate the Pomeroy College of Nursing and St. Joseph's College of Nursing, respectively.

Upstate University Hospital serves as the tertiary medical center hospital for 17 counties in the center of Upstate New York. The hospital includes regional centers for trauma care, neurosurgery, burn care, stroke, AIDS and other specialties including the world-class Golisano Children's Hospital and the Upstate Cancer Center.

SUNY Upstate Medical University houses the only academic medical school in the area; it also collaborates with allied teaching facilities. In 2019, it opened an \$11 million simulation center that simulates realtime responses to medical emergencies throughout the hospital.

The **Syracuse VA Medical Center** is a general medical and surgical referral center including an Acute Care Psychiatric Unit, a Community Living Center, a Spinal Cord Injury/Disorder Center, a Level II Polytrauma Center, an Amputee Center of Care, a new Compensation and Pension examination suite, and a new Women's Wellness Center. It is also a teaching facility affiliated with SUNY Upstate Medical University, serves veterans from 13 counties and operates seven community-based outpatient clinics.

The Syracuse Community Health Center

is a Federally Qualified Health Center serving the Greater Syracuse area and Onondaga County. SCHC serves more than 34,000 patients each year within its network of five health care centers and eight school-based sites, offering: primary care (adult & family medicine), pediatrics, OB/GYN, eye care, dental, podiatry, behavioral health (mental health and substance abuse services), and walk-in care.

Did you know?

St. Joseph's Health Hospital is one of America's 50 Best Hospitals for Cardiac Care and Vascular Surgery according to research released by *Healthgrades*, and the only hospital in New York state to be recognized as one of America's 50 Best Hospitals for Vascular Surgery in 2021.

Upstate Medical University is the region's largest employer with more than 11,000 employees. Upstate University Hospital is the region's only Certified Level 1 Trauma Center. The medical complex also includes Upstate Community Hospital; the Joslin Diabetes Center, a NYS Center of Excellence; and the Epilepsy Clinic, a Level 4 program, the highest designation possible.

More than 4,000 babies are born at **Crouse Health** each year. The Baker Regional Neonatal Intensive Care Unit at Crouse is the highest-level center in the region for complicated pregnancies, deliveries and specialized newborn care.

COVID-19 trials and saliva testing: Upstate Medical University is at the forefront of the nation's fight against coronavirus and COVID-19 with the FDA naming SUNY Upstate's saliva test as one of the best in the world in detecting COVID-19. Upstate's Head of Infectious Disease Stephen Thomas, M.D., is lead principal investigator for the worldwide Pfizer/BioNTech vaccine trial and Upstate led the entire SUNY system in developing saliva-based pooled testing for thousands of college students in New York state."

Tick testing and research: Some of the nation's leading research into tick-borne diseases is happening in Central New York. The Institute for Global Health and Translational Science at Upstate Medical University accepts, collects and tests ticks for the public. More than 7,000 ticks have been tested and tracked across New York state.

2021 marks the 200th birthday of Elizabeth Blackwell: who was the first American woman to ever earn a medical degree. She attended Geneva Medical College, which is now Upstate Medical University, in the late 1840s.

Urgent care explosion: WellNow Urgent Cares have rapidly expanded throughout Central New York, giving patients more options for efficient medical care without having to visit an emergency room. There are now nine locations in the immediate Syracuse area with additional offices in Ithaca, Rome, Oswego and Watertown.

CNY Biotech Accelerator and Upstate MIND: The Biotech Accelerator supports bioscience and medical technology and biotech entrepreneurial activity. Upstate MIND includes the Molecular Pathology Next Generation Sequencing Lab for genetic and molecular testing to predict and prevent disease.

Welch Allyn: Next time you're in the doctor's office — anywhere — look at the name on the medical equipment in the room.

Chances are, it says Welch Allyn. The Skaneateles Falls-based medical equipment company was acquired by Hillrom in 2015.





LOCAL LINGO

Brush up on names, words and landmarks to sound like a Syracuse local.

Salt City Market: Central New York remains abuzz about the new Salt City Market in downtown Syracuse. The market offers a food hall featuring merchants and entrepreneurs selling foods from around the world, as well as living and working space on the upper levels.

Dinosaur: In Syracuse, the word Dinosaur only means one thing: barbecue. Syracuse is home to the original Dinosaur Bar-B-Que restaurant, a honky tonk biker bar and restaurant with some of the best ribs, pulled pork and brisket anywhere on the East Coast. If and when you visit, bring your appetite, a marker to sign the bathroom walls and your patience as a wait for a table (in non-COVID times) can be as long as two hours.

The MOST: It's the museum with the mostest – science that is! The Milton J. Rubenstein Museum of Science and Technology lives in the original armory building at the heart of the Armory Square restaurant and bar district. The family friendly museum includes dozens of interactive science and technology exhibits as well as an IMAX movie theater and new live animals including an armadillo, a porcupine, a scorpion and several snakes.

The Shores of Onondaga Lake: A place that is home to one of our most highly used parks, recreational trails, and an amphitheater to see your favorite band, is the same that is recognized as the inspiration for the U.S. system of representative democracy. The Great Law of Peace, established on the shores of Onondaga Lake by the Six Nations of the Haudenosaunee, became the model for several key clauses in the U.S. constitution.

The Dome: The Carrier Dome at Syracuse University opened in September 1980. The stadium was named after the Carrier Corporation – known for its air conditioning technology even though the Dome did not have air conditioning. The white-bubbletopped Dome got a makeover in 2020 with a new steel structure encircling the building to hold up the new roof and center-field scoreboard. In public communications the university has dropped the Carrier Dome moniker and now refers to the facility as "The Stadium" implying new naming rights to one of Syracuse's most iconic features could be coming soon. **Onondaga:** Be prepared to know how to both say and spell this name because it's everywhere! The name derives from the tribe of Iroquoianspeaking North American Indians who lived in this area. Their ancestors still inhabit the Onondaga Nation, which sits just south of the county. Today you will find parks, streets and businesses bearing the name, in addition to a creek, college, town and the county."

The Parade: The annual St. Patrick's Parade strolls through downtown Syracuse on the Saturday before St. Patrick's Day. Prepandemic, the parade attracts thousands of hardy Central New Yorkers, who are known to line the streets in sun, rain and snow. Parade organizers are eager to bring back this long-standing Syracuse tradition as soon as it is safe to do so.

Lights on the Lake: Open from mid-November to early January each year, Lights on the Lake is a two-mile long, drive-thru attraction featuring dozens of lighted holiday displays at Onondaga Lake Park in Liverpool. It's a fun, affordable way to stay warm and toasty while getting the whole family into the holiday spirit.

Green Lakes: Short for Green Lakes State Park, which is a pristine New York State Park in eastern Onondaga County. Its claim-to-fame are its brightly colored lakes thanks to a unique instance of fall and spring waters not mixing to dilute the colors. The park also includes miles and miles of trails, an 18-hole golf course, a restaurant, public beach, playground, boat house and campground.

Hotel Syracuse: Now officially called the Marriott Syracuse Downtown, many still refer to this gem by its original name, the Hotel Syracuse. Built in 1924, Hotel Syracuse was a hub of downtown for decades. It fell into disrepair before finally closing in 2004. Local developer Ed Riley acquired the building in 2014 and completed a \$57 million renovation before the hotel reopened for business in 2016.

Salt potatoes: Buy a bag of taters in the grocery store here in the summertime and you'll find a small bag of salt in the bottom. Why? Because you're in Syracuse! Once the salt capital of the world (the area was once home to huge salt springs and production companies) Syracusans learned to love their spuds boiled in salty water. The salt coats the skin, which prevents the potato from getting waterlogged. Try them at the fair or make them at home and call yourself a true Syracusan.

Amazon is building a \$350 million, 3.8-million-square-foot state-of-the-art fulfillment center in the town of Clay. The strategically located automated distribution center, which will be the second largest building of its kind in the world, is expected to create 1,000 full-time jobs. These jobs will pay a minimum of \$15 an hour for some roles and higher wages for others, in addition to providing health insurance, 20 weeks of parental leave and other high-quality benefits.

Regional leaders understand the importance of creating good paying, accessible jobs for the un- and underemployed in the region. Site selection on an existing Centro bus service line ensures these jobs are accessible to many CNY residents. CenterState CEO's Work Train team is connecting with Amazon to better understand job openings and skills required to ensure that the community can maximize opportunities for local residents to benefit. Central New York will also benefit from Amazon's policy of providing education and training for their employees. The project is expected to be completed in fall 2021.

Amazon expansion into CNY creates significant opportunity for employment, tax revenue and further business development in the region, including a delivery station slated to open this summer in DeWitt near Interstate 481. The 112,000-square-foot facility is known as a "last mile" delivery facility where packages are transported to delivery stations from Amazon fulfillment centers, sorted and then loaded into vehicles for delivery to customers. The delivery station will create hundreds of full-time and part-time jobs, also paying a minimum of \$15 an hour. A second DeWitt delivery station is scheduled to open as a 12,000-square-foot facility for bulky items, from televisions to couches, by the end of 2020. It will create 50 full- and part-time jobs. **www.amazon.jobs/en**

Did you know?

StateTech Magazine listed Syracuse as one of its "Eight Smart Cities to Watch" in 2020. It counted Syracuse among its "rising smart city stars," due to the city's efforts to expand municipal Wi-Fi with public hot spots and its partnership with Verizon to roll out new 5G cellular data technology. The magazine also cited the city's decision to purchase more than 17,000 streetlights and affix them with smart nodes to monitor important things for city services such as street conditions, air quality and Onondaga Creek's levels, among others. The New York Power Authority also named Syracuse the "flagship smart city" in New York.






MICROSOFT TO OPEN "SMART CITIES" TECH HUB IN SYRACUSE; 3RD IN THE NATION

INVENTIONS WITH CNY TIES

Dentist's chair: Milton Waldo Hanchett, of Syracuse, created and patented the reclining chair for patients allowing dentists a better view inside your mouth.

Brannock Device: A staple of any shoe store, this metal adjustable footmeasuring device was invented by Charles Brannock, of Syracuse.

Serrated knife: Loaves of bread and ripe tomatoes have avoided the dreaded squish since 1919 when Syracuse resident Joseph Burns invented the serrated knife.

The curveball: Baseball hall of fame pitcher William "Candy" Cummings is credited for inventing the curveball pitch. One theory holds that he started developing the pitch in 1864 while at the Falley Seminary in Fulton.


Time clock: Auburn jeweler Williard Bundy is credited with inventing the time clock, allowing employees to "punch in" and "punch out" since the late 1800s.

Traffic signals: The Crouse-Hinds Electric Company was founded in Syracuse in 1897. It specialized in high-grade electrical specialties and were the first to manufacture traffic signals.

Literacy organization: Literacy Volunteers of America, the country's first nonprofit focusing on adult literacy, was founded by Ruth Johnson Colvin, of Syracuse, in 1962.

Plank road: The first plank road in the United States was built in North Syracuse to transport salt and other goods.

Ferris wheel: The first Ferris wheel was built in Syracuse for the New York State Fair. It had four cars that could hold 20 people and was rotated by hand.




