GENIUS NY 2.0 GAINING GLOBAL ATTENTION

On the heels of GENIUS NY's round 1 success, the program is seeing ongoing interest from companies across the globe as it closes its application period for a second round of funding. GENIUS NY received more than 250 submissions for next year's competition and has gained stronger brand awareness in the global unmanned aerial systems (UAS) community. Several applicants reapplied this year; many are from out of state; and a few are from across the globe, including India and Australia. There was also an increase in women-owned businesses

GENIUS NY is the world's largest business accelerator competition for UAS, funded by Empire State Development and housed at CenterState CEO's The Tech Garden. The program provides an unprecedented opportunity for companies to take home more than \$1 million to advance their technologies in the UAS industry.

Last month, GENIUS NY staff attended Interdrone, an international drone conference in Las Vegas, NV, and

met with numerous applicants to continue promoting the program and raise awareness of Central New York as a global hub for unmanned systems. UAS companies at the conference were familiar with the unmanned system efforts being made in Central New York such as the construction of a 50-mile corridor customized for unmanned aircrafts and the creation of NUSTAR, a new testing center for drone safety, durability and cybersecurity.

In addition, a number of investors attending Interdrone were interested in learning about the six current GENIUS NY teams whose accelerator program ends in December and are currently seeking follow-on funding.

CenterState New York Seeks Federal UAS Support at AUVSI

The Central New York and Mohawk Valley regions
were well represented at last month's Association for
Unmanned Vehicle Systems International (AUVSI) Hill
Day lobbying event in the nation's capital. More
than 10 individuals from SRC, Inc., AX Enterprize,
Gryphon Sensors, Lockheed Martin, the NUAIR
Alliance, Griffiss International Airport and
CenterState CEO joined more than 130

participants in briefings and congressional

visits delivering key messages for the

unmanned systems industry. The day

ended with a reception in the foyer of Rayburn House Office Building for the Science and Tech Fair. Exhibiting NUAIR partners included Lockheed Martin and NavMar.

Regional participants were divided among more than a dozen groups and assigned to senators and representatives from across the U.S., including area representatives senators Charles Schumer and Kirsten Gillibrand, and members of the House of Representatives John Katko, Claudia Tenney and Tom Reed.

In addition to topics directly related to the region's UAS initiatives, participants advocated for:

• Support for enhanced government and industry collaboration.

- Commitment to research and development for unmanned systems in the air, on land and sea.
- Support federal appropriations with stable funding providing predictability for the UAS industry.
- Support the National Defense Authorization Act to allow military to increase use of unmanned systems to avoid putting service members directly in harm's way.
- Support a long-term Federal Aviation Administration (FAA)
 Reauthorization bill that extends FAA programs and the UAS
 test sites and funding critical to accelerating commercial UAS
 use.
- Support the Safe DRONE Act, which would extend and fund the UAS test sites, fund college and university UAS workforce development and provide resources to the FAA to speed up their UAS work.
- Oppose legislation giving local authority to restrict UAS operations, eroding safety and UAS operations by creating a complicated patchwork of municipal ordinances.

CNY REGIONAL COUNCIL RECOMMENDS 38 PROJECTS

The Central New York Regional Economic Development Council (CNYREDC) has submitted its seventh progress report and regional revitalization plan update to New York state.

The progress report outlines the success that the CNYREDC has created during the past six years, having received \$906.8 million, including \$500 million through the Upstate Revitalization Initiative (URI) for its strategic plan, CNY Rising. This funding has allowed for expansion of businesses in the community, investments in traditionally underserved neighborhoods and the creation of hundreds of new jobs. Since year one, 72 percent of priority projects from past rounds are complete or on schedule; with 141 projects that have leveraged more than \$1.27 billion in private investment.

This year, the council has recommended 38 priority ESD projects in round 7. These projects represent a total proposed

state investment of more than \$23 million, leveraging \$137.3 million in private and other funding for total project expenses of more than \$158.5 million, and a five-year total payroll of nearly \$100.6 million. Collectively, they support the creation of 582 new jobs, 955 indirect jobs, the retention of 2,216 existing jobs and leverage a return on invest of 13.38 to 1.

The report also highlights progress on state priorities and its CNY Rising plan. All told, more than \$180 million of the \$500 million URI award has been committed to 51 projects. This funding leverages \$849 million in outside project investments and commits more than 1,900 new jobs.

Key initiatives prioritized in CNY Rising and prior year plans outlined in the progress report include:

- Strong progress on building a globally recognized hub for unmanned systems, including development of the nation's largest and most comprehensive 50-mile Beyond Visual Line of Site test corridor, which will enable the next evolution of unmanned civil aviation.
- Companies just half way through the GENIUS NY program's first round have hired new employees and are expanding their customer base in New York, with round two accepting application now.
- Saab Defense and Security USA announced it will invest \$55
 million, move its northeast headquarters to East Syracuse and
 add 260 new high-tech jobs, showing the real and potential
 growth of the unmanned systems and related industries in the region.
- council process and the Upstate
 Revitalization Initiative are transforming
 the region and economy
- Multiple active discussions with agricultural companies looking to expand or move to the region with announcements on those efforts anticipated in the near future.
- Progress on creating greater economic inclusion and mobility within historically underrepresented minority groups; investment to fully fund the Syracuse Promise College Collaborative; and the creation of the Alliance for Economic Inclusion.
- Ongoing discussions and public engagement around Consensus, the commission to modernize local government, on how to improve existing government structures for better decision making.
- Advancement of major projects supported through the URI, such as TCGPlayer.com, which will add 42 jobs in a newly renovated Downtown Syracuse headquarters; Hill Rom/Welch Allyn's plan to invest \$4.2 million and create more than 100 jobs; and ongoing enhancements to the visitor experience at the Great New York State Fair.

"Investments made through the regional council process and the Upstate Revitalization Initiative are transforming the region and economy," said Robert Simpson, president of CenterState CEO and co-chair of the CNYREDC. "While it is still early in the URI's five-year process, the community is seeing its impact in the creation of jobs, new investments and in positive perceptions both from those inside and outside the region. The successes to date are signs of impact yet to come, and the CNYREDC remains committed to driving economic opportunities for the community and advocating on behalf of projects that align with the region's assets and strategies."

AutoModality, a Central New York drone navigation company, recently demonstrated its unique capabilities to Assemblyman Al Stirpe and the Assembly Speaker Carl Heastie at Gryphon Sensors in North Syracuse. The demo highlighted AutoModality's Perceptive Navigation system that allows a drone to navigate autonomously and safely fly very near to objects.

Gryphon Sensors, an SRC company and world-leader in intelligent drone detection systems, hosted the AutoModality demo. Gryphon, SRC, and Automodality are Central New York companies partnering with the NUAIR Alliance to strengthen the region's global leadership position in the unmanned aircraft systems (UAS) sector.

Using 3D maps and sending high-definition video in real-time, AutoModatiliy's drones provide a faster, safer and more efficient method for inspecting buildings, bridges, power lines and other challenging




