
Seneca: This long, thin county sits directly between Seneca and Cayuga lakes, west of Onondaga County. www.co.seneca.ny.us



CenterState New Yorkers love their sports. From professional, collegiate and school teams to recreational leagues and fundraisers, people young and old participate in some form of athletic activity. Whether actively competing or showing support on the sidelines, area residents enjoy sports action at all levels. In addition, the area's numerous sporting facilities encourage more people to become involved, and indoor recreation centers allow athletes to play their sport year-round.

Professional teams include the Syracuse Chiefs baseball team, the AAA Washington Nationals affiliate; the Syracuse Crunch, an AHL hockey team; and the Syracuse Silver Knights, a Major Indoor Soccer League franchise. Collegiate athletic teams include the Division I Syracuse University men's football, basketball (2003 NCAA Champions!), and lacrosse teams with more than 10 national championships. Le Moyne College and Onondaga Community College also boast national titles in baseball, basketball, and volleyball. The greater region is also home to national champions including: Clarkson University's women's ice hockey team (2014 NC champion); SUNY Cortland men's lacrosse (2009 D3 champion); and Cornell University women's ice hockey team advanced to the Frozen Four in 2010, 2011 and 2012.

SIP ON SYRACUSE AND BEYOND

Syracuse has a long and storied brewing history. Centrally located in the state, with rail lines and the Erie Canal nearby, Syracuse was a perfect place to brew and distribute beer during the 1800s. Brewery business peaked during the 1890s when the brewing industry employed 400 people locally and produced about 300,000 barrels of beer and ale each year, according to the Onondaga Historical Association.

Prohibition all but wiped out the industry before it began to re-emerge in 1994 when the microbrewery trend began to sweep across the country, including here in CenterState New York. Nearby Utica is home to one of the country's most historic breweries, now called the F.X. Matt Brewing Company. The facility has been in business since the late 1800s. For many years the brewery's flagship beer was Utica Club, which it still produces, although it is better known for brewing more than 30 different beers in its Saranac line. The brewery also hosts a popular summer concert series, has a gift shop, offers tours and of course — samples.





How to register a child for public school

Call your local school district's main office and ask for instructions. You will likely need proof of address in your school district. If your child is new to school (kindergarten or pre-k), you will likely be required to present a birth certificate, immunization record and a report of a physical exam. If the child is transferring from another school, you may be asked to bring a report card or other transfer paperwork from your child's last school. The school may also ask for an immunization record and a physical exam report. Many school districts now offer registration instructions, forms and information on their websites.





Hospital beds: Onondaga County alone is home to more than 1,600 hospital beds among its three hospitals at four locations.


QUALITY HEALTH CARE IS THE CORE OF OUR COMMUNITY

The Syracuse metropolitan area includes four acute general hospitals: Crouse Hospital, St. Joseph's Hospital Health Center, Upstate University Hospital of the State University of New York, and the Syracuse VA Medical Center. It also includes 11 nursing homes and several ambulatory care facilities.

- CenterState New York is home to more than 1,800 general and specialty practicing physicians.
- Crouse Hospital supports regional centers for obstetrics and neonatology. The hospital also maintains the largest ambulatory surgery programs in the region and is a Chest Pain and Heart Failure Center and a NYS-designated Regional Stroke Center.
- St. Joseph's Hospital Health Center operates the largest programs in the region for cardiology and open heart surgery, and supports major programs in peripheral vascular surgery, nephrology and orthopedics. In 2014, it completed an expansion that includes the addition of 14 operating rooms, 110 private patient rooms, and several green initiatives.

- Upstate Medical University houses the only academic medical school in the area; it also collaborates with allied teaching facilities.
 Crouse Hospital and St. Joseph's Hospital Health Center operate nursing schools.
- Upstate University Hospital serves as the tertiary medical center hospital for a region that includes 17 counties in the center of Upstate New York. The hospital includes regional centers for trauma care, pediatrics, cancer, neurosurgery, burn care, and other specialties.
- In 2014, Upstate opened the Upstate Cancer Center while the Golisano Children's Hospital, on its downtown campus, celebrated its fifth birthday. On the Community General campus, Upstate opened GEM Care, a Senior Emergency Department.
- The Syracuse VA Medical Center serves veterans from
 13 counties and operates seven community-based outpatient clinics.
 In 2013, it opened a \$90 million six-story Spinal Cord Disorder Center.
 It is also a Level II Polytrauma Center and an Amputee Center of Care.
 Additional services are offered through its medicine, neurology, surgery and psychiatry departments.


Chicken Riggies: This creamy, spicy pasta concoction can be found on menus all over the region. Try 'em all to find your favorite!

Regional employment is largest in the educational, health care and retail sectors. However, a number of traditionally strong sectors and new advanced technology industries are expanding locally. Driven by domestic and international demand for products and the presence of a skilled workforce, software development companies and precision manufacturing firms, such as Falk Precision, Inc., have seen an increase in the past year. Engineering, architectural service and environmental systems firms continue to attract a well-paid and skilled workforce to the community. The region is also seeing expansion of thermal and environmental control systems manufacturers based partly on the expanding global market for products in this field and a new consortium of research and economic development partners targeting the growth of innovation in the industry.

SMART SYSTEMS

The CenterState New York region has a strong critical mass of firms, skilled employees, and research institutions that work with smart systems technologies. These applications include radar systems, medical devices, environmental technologies, and cybersecurity systems but are all connected by an underlying technology platform built around sensing and determining a reaction to an environment. These technologies have significant global growth potential and represent one of the region's strongest opportunities for future growth in advanced industries. For example, the commercial market for Unmanned Aerial Systems (a Smart Systems product and a key focus of the Northeast UAS Airspace Integration Research Alliance — NUAIR Alliance) is estimated to reach \$2.8 billion by 2018.



10 INVENTIONS WITH TIES TO CENTERSTATE NEW YORK

24-second shot clock: Invented in Syracuse in 1954, the shot clock put an end to stall tactics, which were hurting the NBA by slowing down the game. A monument in downtown's Armory Square commemorates the invention.

Brannock device: SU grad Charles F. Brannock developed the device to measure the length, width and arch of the human foot. The design he patented in 1926 remains standard in the footwear industry.

Heimlich maneuver: Cornell University graduate Henry Heimlich was the first to describe the method of administering abdominal thrusts to stop a person from choking.

Air conditioning: Willis H. Carrier invented air conditioning. The company bearing his name, Carrier Corporation, had a large presence in Syracuse for many years and has naming rights to Syracuse University's Carrier Dome.

Salt potatoes: Salt potatoes are to Syracuse what chicken wings are to Buffalo - a regional specialty identified with an upstate city. Salt potatoes were invented in the 1800's by local salt workers who boiled small potatoes, skins and all, in brine for an inexpensive lunch. The tasty taters are still enjoyed today; their salt-encrusted skins dipped in melted butter before eating.

Loafers: The A.E. Nettleton Company, of Syracuse, produced the first pair of loafers in 1937.

Dentist's chair: Milton Waldo Hanchett, of Syracuse, is responsible for patenting the reclining chair, which was used as a prototype for the dentist chair.

Pneumatic tire: Prolific inventor Alexander Brown is responsible for cornering the market on inflatable tires for cars. The new design could more easily be attached and detached from a car.

Drive-in window: The country's first drive-in window was installed by Merchants Bank in 1941.

Crouse Hinds: manufactured the country's first traffic light in 1921. America's only upsidedown traffic light appropriately resides on Tipperary Hill, which was settled by Irish immigrants on Syracuse's west side.
