SPORTS FACILITIES

Central New Yorkers love their sports. From professional, collegiate and school teams to recreational leagues and fundraisers, people young and old participate in many forms of athletic activity. Whether actively competing in events like the Dunn Tire Mountain Goat Run, Gillie Girl Sprint Triathlon and Syracuse Half Marathon, or showing support on the sidelines, area residents enjoy sports action at all levels. In addition, numerous sporting facilities encourage more people to become involved and indoor recreation centers allow athletes to play their sport year-round.

Professional teams include the **Syracuse Mets** (formerly the Syracuse Chiefs), the AAA affiliate team of the MLB **New York Mets**. The Mets purchased the team in 2017 and committed to Syracuse for 25 years, prompting a \$26.25 million investment in the team's stadium from state, county and city government. The **Auburn Doubledays** are an affiliate of the **Washington Nationals.** The **Syracuse Crunch** (AHL) are affiliated with the NHL **Tampa Bay Lightning.**

Collegiate athletic teams include the Division I Syracuse University men's football, basketball (2003 NCAA Champions), and lacrosse teams with more than 10 national championships. Both the men's and women's Syracuse University basketball teams made it to the 2016 Final Four. The Orange women advanced to the championship game but lost to the University of Connecticut, which won its fourth straight national title thanks to CNY native Breanna Stewart. The women's field hockey and men's cross-country teams at Syracuse University earned national titles in 2015. Le Moyne College and Onondaga Community College also boast national titles in baseball, basketball and volleyball. The greater region is also home to national champions including: Clarkson University's women's ice hockey team (2014 NC champion); SUNY Cortland men's soccer team won the 2016 State University of New York Athletic Conference Championship; and the Cornell University women's ice hockey team has won the ECAC hockey regular-season championship in 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013.

BREWERIES

Syracuse has a long and storied brewing history. Centrally located in the state, with rail lines and the Erie Canal nearby, Syracuse was a perfect place to brew and distribute beer during the 1800s. Brewery business peaked during the 1890s when the brewing industry employed 400 people locally and produced about 300,000 barrels of beer and ale each year, according to the Onondaga Historical Association. Prohibition all but wiped out the industry before it began to re-emerge in 1994 when the microbrewery trend began to sweep across the country, including here in Central New York, which is now home to more than a dozen microbreweries.



East

The Baldwins: The matriarch of the famous Baldwin family – Carol, mom to Alec, Daniel, Billy and Stephen – lives in the Syracuse area. Her sons have been spotted in and around the region and Alec has spoken publicly about how much his family loves Wegmans supermarkets.

Tom Cruise: Award-winning actor Tom Cruise was born in Syracuse.

Eric Carle: The famous children's author and illustrator was born in Syracuse in 1929. He is best known for "The Very Hungry Caterpillar."

Jon Fishman: The drummer for rock band Phish attended Jamesville-DeWitt High School in Central New York.

Jimmy Van Heusen: The American composer was born in Syracuse and studied at Cazenovia Seminary and Syracuse University before winning four Academy Awards for his work.

How to register a child for public school

Call your local school district's main office and ask for instructions. You will likely need proof of address in your school district. If your child is new to school (kindergarten or pre-k), you will likely be required to present a birth certificate, immunization record and a report of a physical exam. If the child is transferring from another school, you may be asked to bring a report card or other transfer paperwork from your child's last school. The school may also ask for an immunization record and a physical exam report. Many school districts now offer registration instructions, forms and information on their websites.



SPECIALIZED MEDICAL FACILITIES. For those needing medical treatment, St. Joseph's Health, SUNY Upstate Medical University and Crouse Health have each expanded dramatically in the last 10 years. The world-class Golisano Children's Hospital, SUNY Upstate's new Cancer Center and the Syracuse VA Medical Center serve patients from across the state.

CENTRAL NEW YORK HEALTH CARE QUICK FACTS

Same-day radiation for breast cancer: Upstate University Hospital is the first hospital in the region to offer intraoperative radiation therapy, which is the delivery of radiation during surgery to remove breast cancer. The innovative procedure can reduce radiation treatments – and trips to the hospital – from 15 to 20 to just one, at the same time as surgery.

Liver transplant clinic: The University of Rochester Medical Center has opened an ambulatory clinic site at St. Joseph's Health, which will offer care closer to home for hundreds of liver transplant patients who live in Central New York and the Mohawk, Hudson Valley, Capital and Northern New York regions.

CNY Biotech Accelerator and Upstate MIND: The Biotech Accelerator supports bioscience and medical technology and biotech entrepreneurial activity. Upstate MIND includes the Molecular Pathology Next Generation Sequencing Lab for genetic and molecular testing to predict and prevent disease.

Concussion Management Program and CNY Sports Concussion Center at Upstate Medical University: Recognized by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention as a significant public health issue, this Syracuse facility is on the cutting-edge of concussion research and treatment. **Penicillin & Bristol-Myers Squibb:** The Bristol-Myers Squibb factory in East Syracuse is responsible for helping create the world's first synthetic penicillin. For many years, the company produced more of the antibiotic than anyone else in the world. Bristol-Myers Squibb, with a local manufacturing facility since 1943, also makes Abilify, Eliquis and Plavix.

Elizabeth Blackwell: The first American woman to ever earn a medical degree attended Geneva Medical College, which is now Upstate Medical University, in the late 1840s.

Welch Allyn: Next time you're in the doctor's office — anywhere — look at the name on the medical equipment in the room. Chances are, it says Welch Allyn. The Skaneateles Falls-based medical equipment company was acquired by Hill-Rom Holdings in 2015 for \$2.05 billion.

Early hospital: Syracuse was an early leader in health care services as the first public hospital opened in 1870.

Poison Control Center at Upstate Medical University: 90 percent of calls are handled without further need for medical care, saving millions of dollars each year.

- **Crouse Health** supports regional centers for obstetrics and neonatology. The hospital also maintains the largest ambulatory surgery programs in the region and is a Chest Pain and Heart Failure Center and a NYS-designated Regional Stroke Center. Crouse Health recently opened a new 52,000-square-foot emergency department.
- **St. Joseph's Health** operates the largest programs in the region for cardiology and open heart surgery, and supports major programs in peripheral vascular surgery, nephrology and orthopedics. In 2018, the hospital completed a \$32 million project to open a new 45,000-square-foot Cardiovascular Care Center. The space includes additional procedure rooms, a new operating room and expanded and renovated spaces for patients as well as technology upgrades.
- Crouse Health and St. Joseph's Health operate the Pomeroy College of Nursing and St. Joseph's College of Nursing, respectively.
- Upstate University Hospital serves as the tertiary medical center hospital for 17 counties in the center of Upstate New York. The hospital includes regional centers for trauma care, neurosurgery, burn care and other specialties including the Golisano Children's Hospital and Upstate Cancer Center. The cancer center expanded by two additional floors in 2018 with a new, state-of-the-art clinical pathology lab and an additional 20,000 square feet to see patients.
- SUNY Upstate Medical University houses the only academic medical school in the area; it also collaborates with allied teaching facilities. In 2016, Upstate Medical University completed the CNY Biotech Accelerator and unveiled the Medical Innovation and Novel Discovery Center (Upstate MIND).
- The **Syracuse VA Medical Center** is a teaching facility affiliated with SUNY Upstate Medical University. It serves veterans from 13 counties and operates seven communitybased outpatient clinics. It features a \$90 million sixstory Spinal Cord Disorder Center, a Level II Polytrauma Center, an Amputee Center of Care, a new Compensation and Pension examination suite, and a new Women's Wellness Center. Additional services are offered through its medicine, neurology, surgery and psychiatry departments.



LOCAL LINGO

Brush up on names, words and landmarks to sound like a Syracuse local.

Green Lakes: Short for Green Lakes State Park, which is a pristine New York State Park in eastern Onondaga County. Its claim-to-fame are its uniquely colored lakes thanks to a rare instance of fall and spring waters not mixing to dilute the colors. The park also includes miles and miles of trails, an 18-hole golf course, a restaurant, public beach, playground, boat house and campground.

Hotel Syracuse: Now officially called the Marriott Syracuse Downtown, many still refer to this gem by its original name, the Hotel Syracuse. Built in 1924, Hotel Syracuse was a hub of downtown for decades. It fell into disrepair before finally closing in 2004. Local developer Ed Riley acquired the building in 2014 and completed a \$57 million renovation before the hotel reopened for business in August 2016.

M Street: Short for Marshall Street, which is just off the Syracuse University campus and home to a smattering of great food and drink options for students and game-goers. It's also where hundreds if not thousands of students took to the streets — and the trees — to celebrate the men's basketball national championship in 2003.

Congress: It's back in session in Syracuse with the re-launch of this historic local brew by Willow Rock Brewing Company. The Haberle brewery made Congress Beer from the late 1800s until the 1960s. Willow Rock worked with the Onondaga Historical Association to use notes on the original recipe to recreate the beer.

Salt potatoes: Buy a bag of taters in the grocery store here in the summertime and you'll find a small bag of salt in the bottom. Why? Because you're in Syracuse! Once the salt capital of the world (the area was once home to huge salt springs and production companies) Syracusans learned to love their spuds boiled in salty water. The salt coats the skin, which

prevents the potato from getting waterlogged. Try them at the fair or make them at home and call yourself a true Syracusan.

Caz: Short for Cazenovia, the quaint village sits on the edge of Cazenovia Lake. Some of the region's oldest history can be traced to Cazenovia, which is home to the Lorenzo State Historic Site and the beautiful Brewster Inn.

Empire: Now when you say "Wanna go to Empire?" you have two options: one in downtown Syracuse and another in Cazenovia. Armory Square is home to the original Empire Brewing Company, famous for its eclectic menu, live music and of course, craft beer. And open

since 2016, the Empire Farm Brewery is a 40,000-square-foot facility that features a 60-barrel brewery, pub and restaurant. The grounds include a hops farm and outdoor seating area with fire pits and bright orange Adirondack chairs.

The Melo Center: Short for the Carmelo K. Anthony Center at Syracuse University, The Melo Center is a 54,000-square-foot basketball facility named after NBA player and former SU standout Carmelo Anthony, who donated \$3 million to the project. The dynamic player led SU to the 2003 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship. The facility is attached to Manley Field House.

The Parade: The annual St. Patrick's Parade strolls through downtown Syracuse on the Saturday before St. Patrick's Day (unless it falls on a Saturday). The parade attracts thousands of hardy Central New Yorkers, who are known to line the streets in sun, rain and snow.

Wegmans: Central New Yorkers take great pride in showing off the chain of grocery stores, beloved by everyone from Alec Baldwin to throngs of Syracuse University students for decades. Wegmans is known for being a great place to shop and eat, as many stores in the area boast coffee bars and hot food buffets that feature sushi, Chinese food, pizza and more. Wegmans DeWitt has also opened a Burger Bar, Mexican food station and specialty pizza counter.







Unifly is an excellent example of how the UAS ecosystem all comes together in Central New York. In August 2018, Unifly — the leading provider of unmanned aerial systems traffic management (UTM) in Europe — announced that it was entering into an agreement with NUAIR to provide UTM services for the 50-mile corridor, and leveraging an incentive from the UAS Central Job Fund to establish its North American corporate headquarters in Syracuse, creating about 40 new jobs. INVENTIONS WITH CNY TIES

Ferris Wheel: The first Ferris Wheel was built in Syracuse for the New York State Fair. It had four cars that could hold 20 people and was rotated by hand.

Air-cooled engine: Designed for the Franklin automobile, the first air-cooled engine was manufactured in Syracuse in 1902. It now lives in the Smithsonian Institute.

Penicillin: Bristol Laboratories (now Bristol-Myers Squibb) manufactured the first synthetic penicillin here in 1959.

Drive-in bank window: The first customer to drive up to a bank and do business did it in Syracuse when Merchant's Bank opened the first drive-in bank window here in 1941.

Shot clock: The owners of the Syracuse Nationals basketball team invented the shot clock in 1954 to quicken the game and attract more fans.

Cellophane: The discoverer of the kitchen staple is from Cortland County.

Loafers: The A.E. Nettleton Company, of Syracuse, created the first pair of loafers in 1937.

Brannock Device: Charles Brannock, whose father owned the Park-Brannock Shoe Co. in downtown Syracuse, invented the device in 1926 to measure shoe sizes – still in use today.

Lacrosse: The originators of modern-day lacrosse can be traced to the Cayuga, Oneida, Onondaga, Mohawk, Seneca and Tuscarora tribes of Central and Upstate New York.

Dental chair: The next time you go for a cleaning, credit Milton Waldo Hanchett, of Syracuse, for the chair he invented in 1840.




