



Both the men's and women's Syracuse University basketball teams made it to the 2016 Final Four. The Orange women advanced to the championship game but lost to the University of Connecticut, which won its fourth straight national title thanks to CNY native Breanna Stewart. The women's field hockey and men's crosscountry teams at Syracuse University earned national titles in 2015. Le Moyne College and Onondaga Community College also boast national titles in baseball, basketball and volleyball. The greater region is also home to national champions including: Clarkson University's women's ice hockey team (2014 NC champion); **SUNY Cortland** men's soccer team won the 2016 State University of New York Athletic Conference Championship; and the Cornell University women's ice hockey team has won the ECAC hockey regular-season championship in 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013.



Winding its way through the city of Syracuse is the Onondaga Creekwalk—a 2.6-mile, 13-foot-wide trail that is ideal for running, walking or biking. The Creekwalk, which runs from the historic Armory Square district in downtown Syracuse to the southeast shore of Onondaga Lake, sits alongside the gurgling Onondaga Creek. The federal government awarded the project \$10 million 2016. SIP ON SYRACUSE & BEYOND

Syracuse has a long and storied brewing history. Centrally located in the state, with rail lines and the Erie Canal nearby, Syracuse was a perfect place to brew and distribute beer during the 1800s. Brewery business peaked during the 1890s when the brewing industry employed 400 people locally and produced about 300,000 barrels of beer and ale each year, according to the Onondaga Historical Association. Prohibition all but wiped out the industry before it began to re-emerge in 1994 when the microbrewery trend began to sweep across the country, including here in Central New York.

Local pubs have seen tremendous growth and success within the last few years. Empire Brewing Company, based in Syracuse, opened its new Empire Farmstead Brewery in Cazenovia. The facility grows ingredients for Empire brews right on site, and features a brewery and a tasting room.

CENTRAL NEW YORK HEALTH CARE QUICK FACTS

Central New York Biotech Accelerator and Upstate MIND: The Biotech Accelerator opened in 2012 to support bioscience and medical technology and biotech entrepreneurial activity. Upstate MIND includes the Molecular Pathology Next Generation Sequencing Lab for genetic and molecular testing to predict and prevent disease.

Digital Autopsy Table: Upstate MIND features a \$100,000 machine that displays digital scans of human bodies (both alive and dead). Students use the images to explore the human anatomy without a physical cadaver and doctors can use it to plan surgeries.

Concussion Management Program and CNY Sports Concussion Center at Upstate Medical University: Recognized by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention as a significant public health issue, this Syracuse facility is on the cutting-edge of concussion research and treatment. The center also offers community education and outreach.

Penicillin & Bristol-Myers Squibb: The Bristol-Myers Squibb factory in East Syracuse is responsible for helping create the world's first synthetic penicillin. For many years, the company produced more of the antibiotic than anyone else in the world. Bristol-Myers Squibb, with a local manufacturing facility since 1943, also makes Abilify, Eliquis and Plavix.

Elizabeth Blackwell: The first American woman to ever earn a medical degree attended Geneva Medical College, which is now Upstate Medical University, in the late 1840s.

Hospital beds: Onondaga County alone is home to more than 1,600 hospital beds among its four hospitals at five locations.

Welch Allyn: Next time you're in the doctor's office—anywhere—look at the name on the medical equipment in the room. Chances are, it says Welch Allyn. The Skaneateles Falls-based medical equipment company was acquired by Hill-Rom Holdings in 2015 for \$2.05 billion.

Eye exam invention: Welch Allyn's founders Dr. Francis A. Welch and William Noah Allyn built the first hand-held ophthalmoscope, used in routine eye exams, about 1910.

Early hospital: Syracuse was an early leader in health care services as the first public hospital opened in 1870.

Poison Control Center at Upstate Medical University: 90 percent of calls are handled without further need of medical care, saving millions of dollars each year.

Co-inventor of the pill: Dr. Gregory Goodwin Pincus, a biologist and researcher, is credited with helping invent the combined oral contraceptive pill. He earned a bachelor's degree in agriculture from Cornell University in 1924.



QUALITY HEALTH CARE IS THE CORE OF OUR COMMUNITY

The Syracuse metropolitan area includes four acute general hospitals: Crouse Health, St. Joseph's Health, Upstate University Hospital of the State University of New York, and the Syracuse VA Medical Center. It also includes 11 nursing homes and several ambulatory care facilities.

- More than 1,800 general and specialty practicing physicians call Central New York home.
- Crouse Health supports regional centers for obstetrics and neonatology. The hospital also maintains the largest ambulatory surgery programs in the region and is a Chest Pain and Heart Failure Center and a NYS-designated Regional Stroke Center. This year, Crouse opened a new patient care unit and is building a new 52,000-square-foot emergency department.
- St. Joseph's Health operates the largest programs in the region for cardiology and open heart surgery, and supports major programs in peripheral vascular surgery, nephrology and orthopedics. In 2014, it completed an expansion that included the addition of 14 operating rooms, 110 private patient rooms and several green initiatives.
- Crouse Health and St. Joseph's Health operate the Pomeroy College of Nursing and St. Joseph's College of Nursing, respectively.
- Upstate University Hospital serves as the tertiary medical center hospital for 17 counties in the center of Upstate New York. The hospital includes regional centers for trauma care, neurosurgery, burn care and other specialties including the Golisano Children's Hospital and Upstate Cancer Center.
- Upstate Medical University houses the only academic medical school in the area; it also collaborates with allied teaching facilities. In 2016, UMU completed the Central New York Biotech Accelerator and unveiled the Medical Innovation and Novel Discovery Center (Upstate MIND).
- The Syracuse VA Medical Center serves veterans from 13 counties and operates seven community-based outpatient clinics. It features a \$90 million six-story Spinal Cord Disorder Center, a Level II Polytrauma Center and an Amputee Center of Care. Additional services are offered through its medicine, neurology, surgery and psychiatry departments.



LOCAL LINGO

Brush up on names, words and landmarks to sound like a local

The Amp: Opened in late summer 2015, "the Amp" is short for Lakeview Amphitheater, a lakeside concert venue that can accommodate nearly 18,000 people. With beautiful Onondaga Lake as a backdrop, 2016 concerts included Dave Matthews Band, Phish and Keith Urban.

Dino: Now with nine locations across the East Coast, Dinosaur Bar-B-Que is world-famous for its delicious grub. Sound like a local by keeping the name short when you roll up to the original location in downtown Syracuse. (And wear loose pants.)

Tipp Hill: This tight-knit community on the west side of Syracuse takes great pride in its Irish heritage. Visit a local Irish restaurant, gift shop or watering hole, run the annual Shamrock Run and be sure to swing by the famous green-on-top traffic light.

Baby elephant: The biggest baby in town is Batu, an Asian elephant calf born in May 2015 at the Rosamond Gifford Zoo. Thousands of visitors visit the zoo each year and can now see Batu splash around in a new \$1.8 million water feature, opened in summer 2016.

Lights on the Lake: Open from mid-November to early January each year, Lights on the Lake is a two-mile long, drive-through attraction featuring dozens of lighted holiday displays at Onondaga Lake Park in Liverpool. It's a fun, affordable way to stay warm and toasty while getting the whole family into the holiday spirit.

The Dome: The nickname for the Carrier Dome, this marshmallow-looking landmark is home to Syracuse University sports and hosts many other events throughout the year.

Creekwalk: The Onondaga Creekwalk is a 2.6-mile long paved trail that stretches from downtown Syracuse to Onondaga Lake. The eventual plan is to connect the Creekwalk to the Loop the Lake Trail and the Erie Canalway Trail.

Utica greens: Named for the Upstate city to the east, Utica Greens are a popular dish in Central New York. Recipes vary but the base is usually a leafy green such as escarole with bacon or prosciutto, peppers, breadcrumbs and grated cheese.

The Fair: While the Central New York region is home to dozens of fairs and festivals throughout the year, the New York State Fair, which runs for 10 days at the end of each summer, is king. Annual attendance often surpasses one million people. The fairgrounds are also undergoing a \$50 million makeover courtesy of the state, this year.

Onondaga (pronounced on-uhn-daw-guh): You'll find it everywhere. It's the name of a county, town, college, school district, lake park and several roads, some of which intersect!

Coney: Stand in line at any hot dog stand and you will hear folks debating the pronunciation of this white hot dog made from pork, beef and veal. Is it coney or coonie? No matter how you pronounce it, it will always be a local favorite.

Chicken Riggies: This creamy, spicy pasta concoction can be found on menus all over the region. Try 'em all to find your favorite!

Lacrosse: Originating with Native Americans, Central New York is a hotbed for lacrosse enthusiasts and talent. Many local schools start programs in elementary school and both girls and boys, men and women excel in programs at local high schools and colleges.

Stickley Furniture: The high-quality, handcrafted furniture company, famous for its Mission designs, is based in nearby Manlius.



Global Center for Unmanned Systems

There is significant interest from global UAS firms in the region because of its designation as one of seven federally approved UAS test sites in the U.S. The potential UAS market size is estimated to grow to approximately \$89 billion worldwide by 2022, creating a unique opportunity for domestic and foreign-owned businesses. The NUAIR Alliance, manager of the region's UAS test site, is working with Cornell University, Lockheed Martin, NASA and numerous others to conduct complex tests.

- International gatherings in 2016, CNY hosted the UAS Traffic Management (UTM) Convention, drawing more than 700 attendees from 18 countries to discuss topics related to UTM development and implementation.
- **Hub for UAS-related business** The region's test site has seen an explosion in demand—conducting 645 test flights last year, a tenfold increase from the year before—further establishing the region as a hub for UAS testing and business opportunities.
- World's largest UAS competition The GENIUS NY business competition received more than 250 applications, including 25 from foreign countries, and awarded \$1 million, \$600,000 and \$400,000 to three companies focused on the unmanned systems and internet of things sectors. The in-residence business competition and accelerator at The Tech Garden also offers stipends, housing, resources, programming and connections. www.geniusny.com
- State Support and investment The state of New York is firmly committed to strengthening the UAS industry in the region, and offers a wide range of incentives for companies to expand operations or create a location in New York. Additionally, a new \$30 million state investment will develop a 50-mile flight traffic management corridor between Syracuse and Griffiss International Airport, in Rome. NASA is collaborating with the NUAIR Alliance to develop the UTM system. This new corridor will create opportunities for the world's leading sensor companies to deploy, test and validate their systems in support of UTM, for data integrators to test their software on multiple sensing platforms and for industry leading platforms to test and validate their technologies in a fully instrumented, beyond visual line of sight capable environment. www.nuairalliance.org

New York-Grown, Globally Enjoyed

A resilient climate, affordable land, abundant water and deep agricultural expertise, CNY has it all. As the demand for locally grown fresh produce increases around the globe, CNY is investing in controlled environment agriculture to allow locally grown products to be enjoyed year-round while also investing in innovative solutions such as aseptic packaging facilities. Global Manufacturing and Logistics Hub

INVENTIONS WITH CNY TIES

Traffic signals: The Crouse-Hinds Electric Company was founded in Syracuse in 1897. They specialized in high-grade electrical specialties and were the first to manufacture traffic signals.

Shifting bicycle gears: The C.E. Lipe Machine Shop, located in Syracuse in 1880 can take credit for inventing the two-speed Hy-Lo Bi-Gear for bicycles.

Drive-thru: Maybe it had something to do with the snow even then but Merchants National Bank and Trust Company introduced the first automobile "drive-in bank" in 1949.

Literacy organization: Literacy Volunteers of America, the country's first nonprofit focusing on adult literacy, was founded by Ruth Johnson Colvin, of Syracuse, in 1962.

Dental chair: The next time you go for a cleaning, credit Milton Waldo Hanchett, of Syracuse, for the chair he invented in 1840.

Outdoor lighting: While a student at Cornell University, Elmer A. Sperry invented and installed the first outdoor electric lighting.

24-second shot clock: Invented in Syracuse in 1954, the shot clock put an end to stall tactics, which were hurting the NBA by slowing down the game. A monument in downtown's Armory Square commemorates the invention.

American Girl dolls: Pleasant Rowland, a Wells College graduate, who has deep ties to Aurora in Cayuga County, created the American Girl brand in 1986. She later sold the company to Mattel for \$700 million.

Salt potatoes: Salt potatoes are to Syracuse what chicken wings are to Buffalo—a regional specialty identified with an upstate city. Salt potatoes were invented in the 1800's by local salt workers who boiled small potatoes, skins and all, in brine for an inexpensive lunch. The tasty taters are still enjoyed today; their salt-encrusted skins dipped in melted butter before eating.


