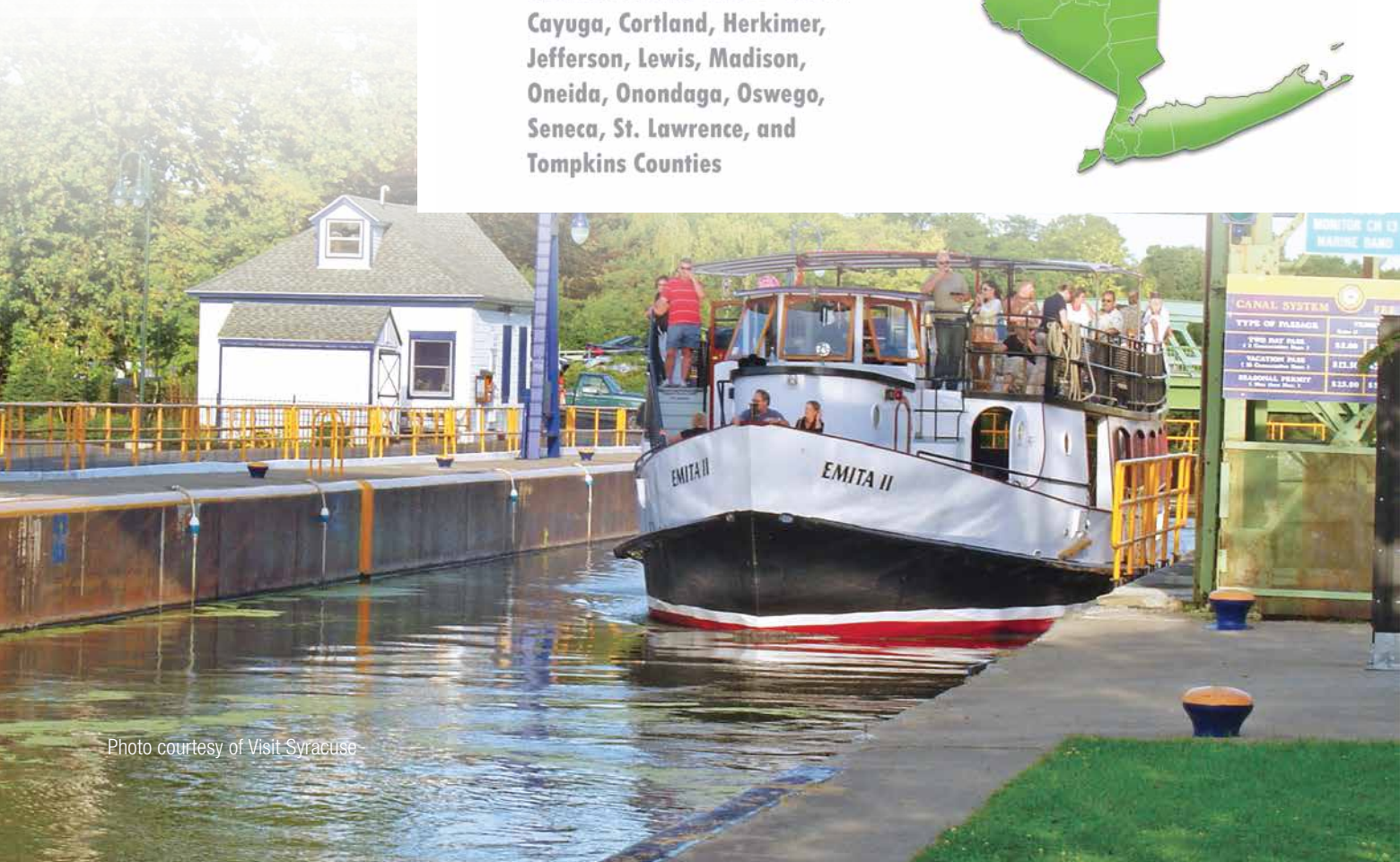
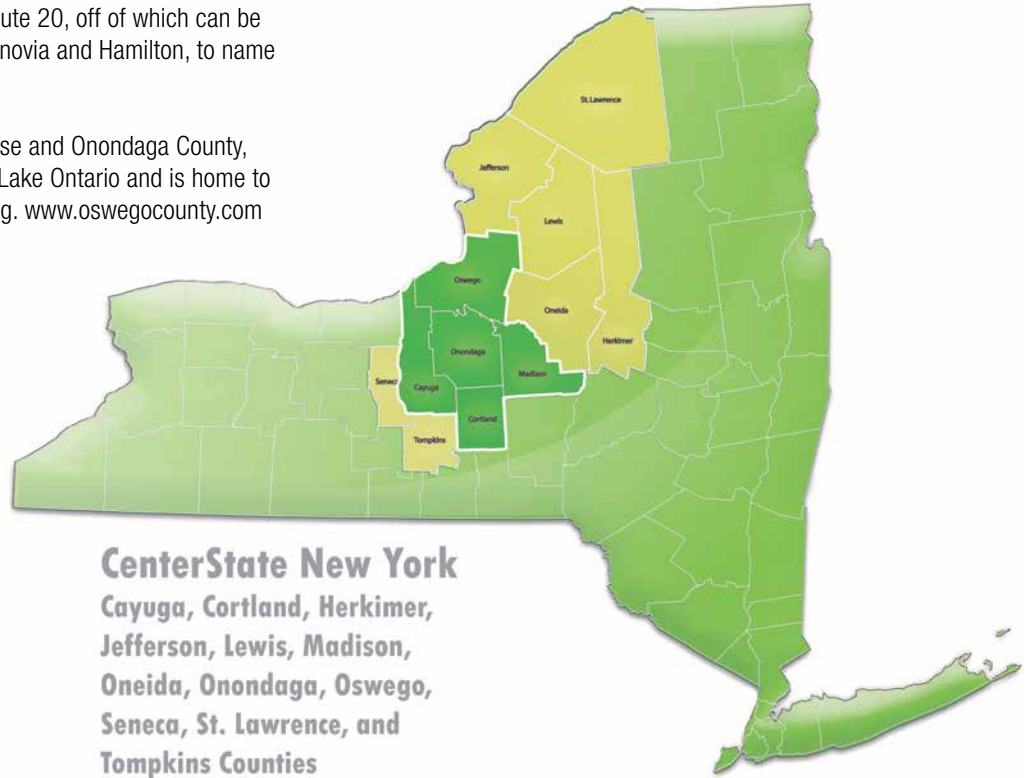
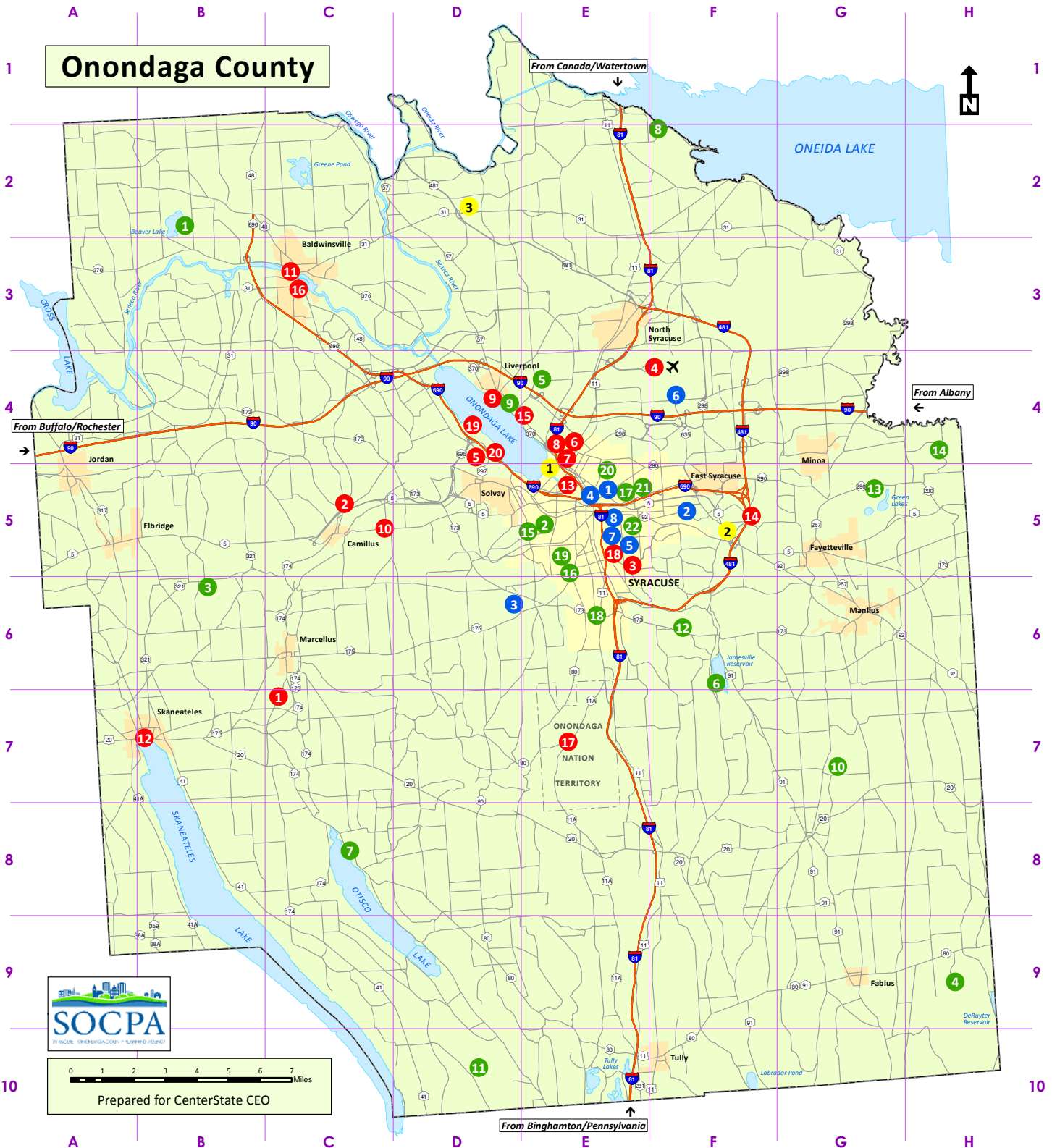

I AM DRAWN TO MY NEIGHBORHOOD BECAUSE there is so much it offers here.

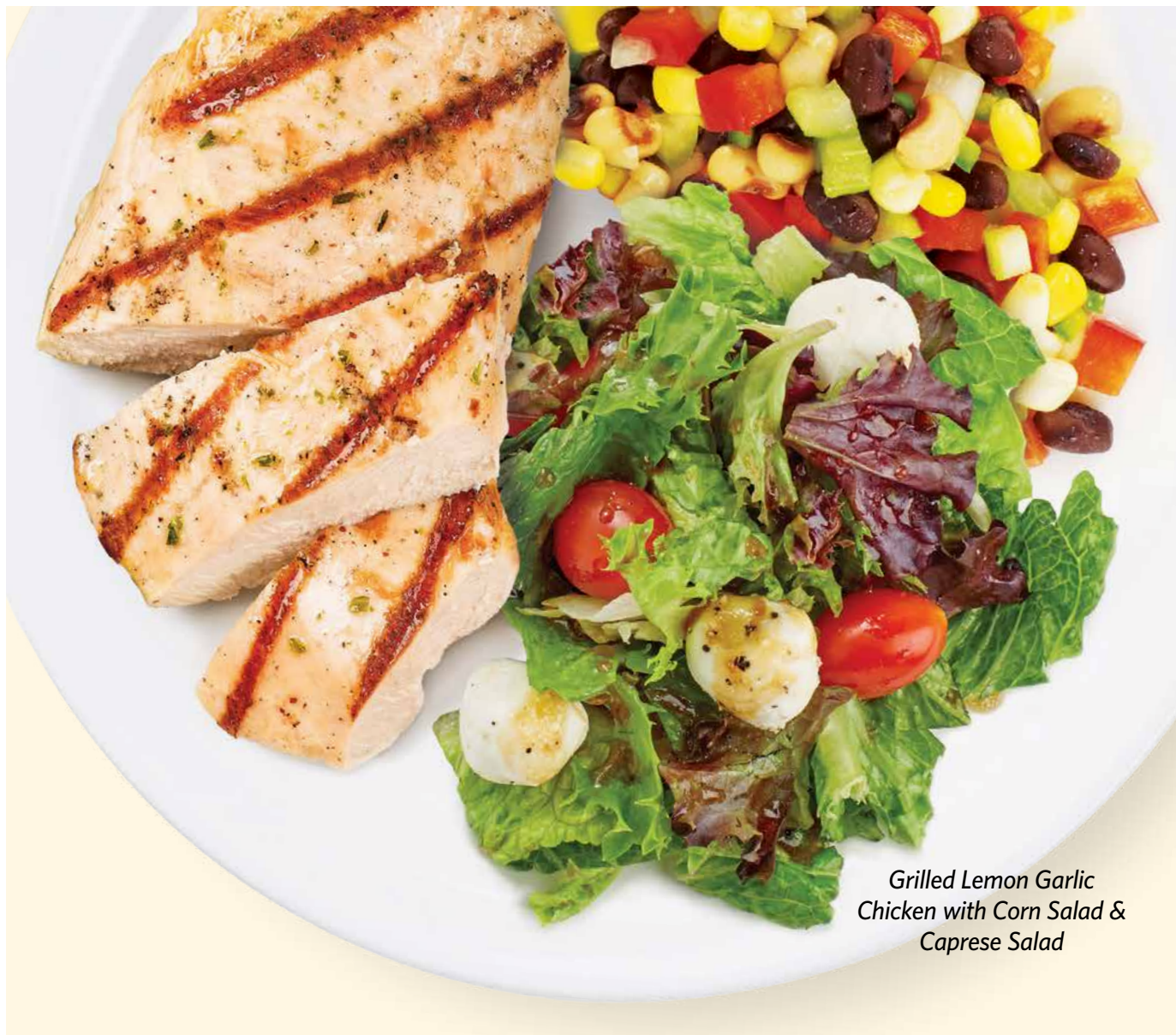
MY FAVORITE LOCAL HAUNT IS all the local businesses around me. I love to support them.

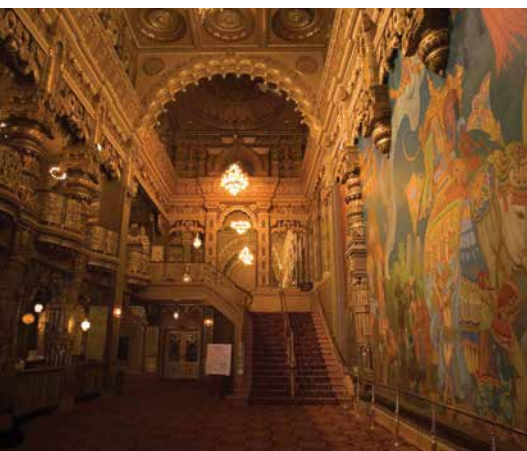

SYRACUSE & THE UNDERGROUND RAILROAD

Syracuse had long been a hub of anti-slavery activity. The “Underground Railroad,” a network of safe houses and routes from points in the southern United States to the country’s northern borders, was used during the 1800s to get runaway slaves to freedom in free states and Canada. Curator of history for the Onondaga Historical Association, Robert Searing, says Syracuse became the “great central depot” of the Underground Railroad. On Oct. 1, 1851, an escaped slave named William Henry, who was known as Jerry, was seized for a hearing by five U.S. marshals near the Erie Canal at the southeast corner of what is now Clinton and Water streets. After a failed escape attempt, Jerry was moved to the police station. Jermaine Loguen and Samuel May, both ministers, formed a plan to help Jerry. A large crowd visiting the city for an anti-slavery convention gathered in front of the building where Jerry was being held. Upon a signal from the leaders, the crowd broke into the jail, freed Jerry, and helped him escape to Canada. A monument was added to downtown Syracuse’s Clinton Square in 1990 to commemorate the event that became known as the Jerry Rescue. Source: NationalGeographic.com.

Take a ski or a golf lesson, hop in a running group or join a beach volleyball league — all great ways to make new friends and meet your neighbors.

Professional teams include the **Syracuse Mets*** the AAA affiliate team of MLB **New York Mets**. The Mets just completed their inaugural season in Syracuse with record attendance and countless summer nights of fun on the field. NBT Bank Stadium, home to the Mets, is about to undergo a \$25 million makeover that is sure to make fans happy.

The **Auburn Doubledays** are an affiliate of the **Washington Nationals**. The **Syracuse Crunch*** (AHL) are affiliated with the NHL **Tampa Bay Lightning**.

Collegiate athletic teams include the Division I **Syracuse University*** men's football, basketball (2003 NCAA Champions), and lacrosse teams with more than 10 national championships. Both the men's and women's basketball teams made it to the 2016 Final Four. The Orange women advanced to the championship game, but lost to the University of Connecticut, which won its fourth straight national title thanks to CNY native Breanna Stewart. The women's field hockey and men's cross-country teams at Syracuse University earned national titles in 2015. **Le Moyne College*** and **Onondaga Community College*** also boast national titles in baseball, basketball and volleyball. In addition, the greater region is home to national champions including: **Clarkson University's** women's ice hockey team (2014 NC champion); **SUNY Cortland's*** men's soccer team won the 2016 State University of New York Athletic Conference Championship; and the **Cornell University*** women's ice hockey team has won the ECAC hockey regular-season championship in 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2019.

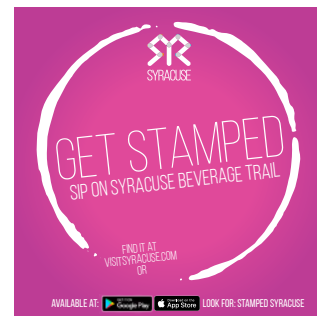

BREWERIES

Syracuse has a long and storied brewing history. Centrally located in the state, with rail lines and the Erie Canal nearby, Syracuse was a perfect place to brew and distribute beer during the 1800s. Brewery business peaked during the 1890s when the brewing industry employed 400 people locally and produced about 300,000 barrels of beer and ale each year, according to the Onondaga Historical Association. Prohibition all but wiped out the industry before it began to re-emerge in 1994 when the microbrewery trend began to sweep across the country, including here in Central New York, which is now home to more than a dozen microbreweries.

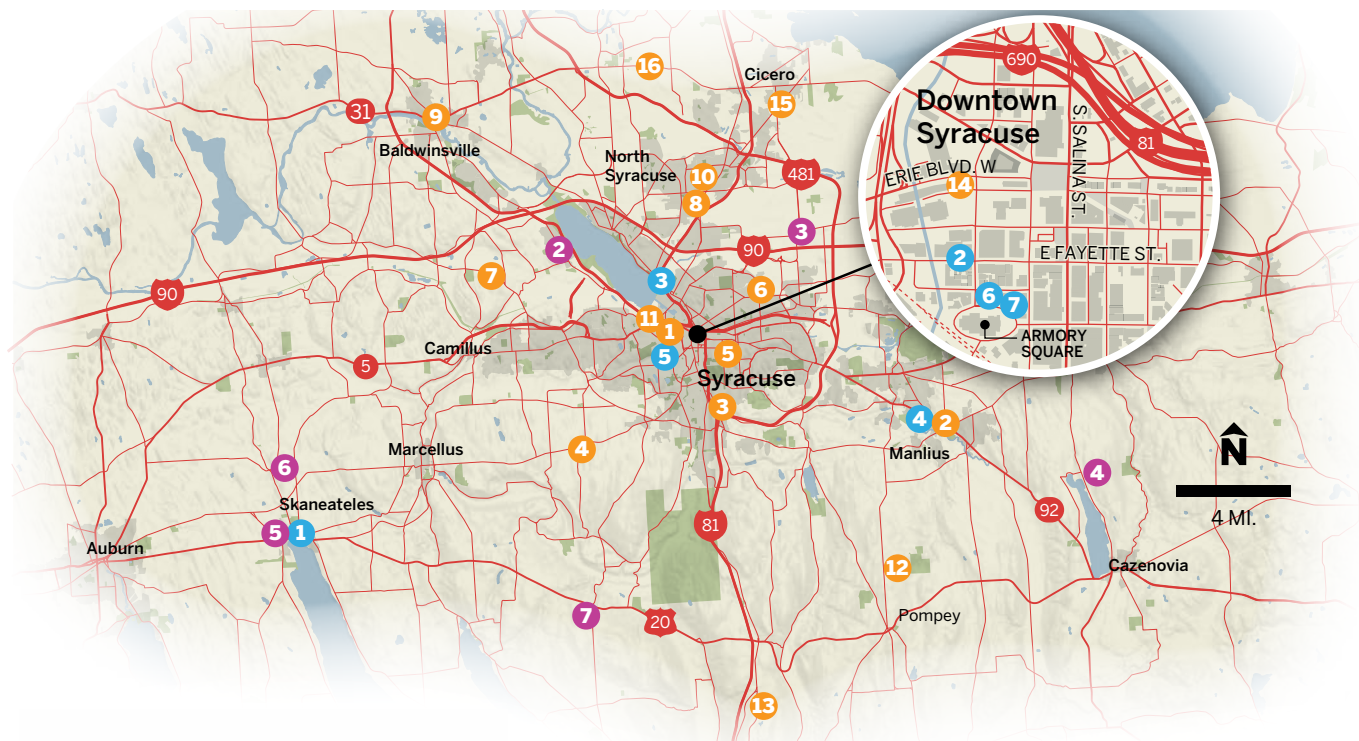

The Pike Block in the heart of downtown, Courier Building and Merchants Commons in Hanover Square, Franklin View Terrace and Mission Landing in Franklin Square, Creekwalk Commons in Clinton Square, Center Armory, Greenway Place, Icon Tower, Loews Landmark Condos and Nettleton Commons all provide fashionable addresses overlooking the city streets.

Syracuse neighborhoods include: *Downtown, University Hill, Westcott Nation, Eastwood, Sedgwick, Strathmore, the North Side, Tipperary Hill and Little Italy.*

ONONDAGA COUNTY SUBURBS

East

Towns and villages: DeWitt, Fayetteville, Jamesville, Manlius.
The eastern suburbs of Syracuse offer neighborhoods near the hustle and bustle of businesses and restaurants along two main thoroughfares, Erie Boulevard East (Route 5) and East Genesee Street (Route 92), and at Towne Center in Fayetteville.

North

Towns and villages: Baldwinsville, Cicero, Clay, Liverpool, Lysander, Salina, Van Buren.
There is a working lock (Lock 24) located on the Seneca River in the heart of Baldwinsville, and nearby Timber Banks is one of the area's residential showpieces. South

West

Looming high over the city of Syracuse is historic Onondaga Hill, which is also home to Onondaga Community College.

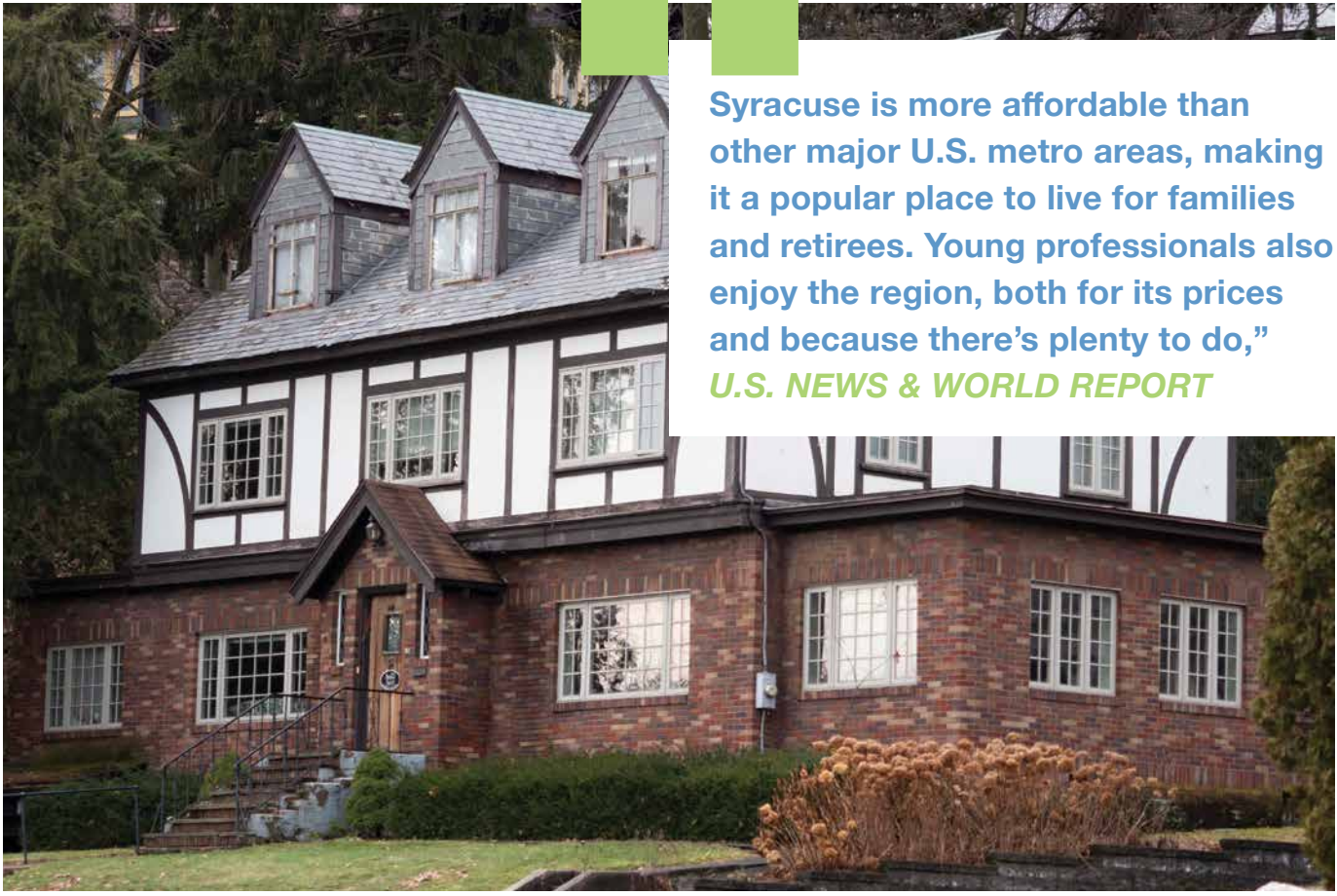

How to register a child for public school

Many school districts offer registration instructions, forms and information on their websites or you can call the district's main office for instructions. You will likely need proof of address in your school district. If your child is new to school (kindergarten or pre-k), you will likely be required to present a birth certificate, immunization record and a report of a physical exam. If the child is transferring from another school, you may be asked to bring a report card or other transfer paperwork from your child's last school. The school may also ask for an immunization record and a physical exam report.

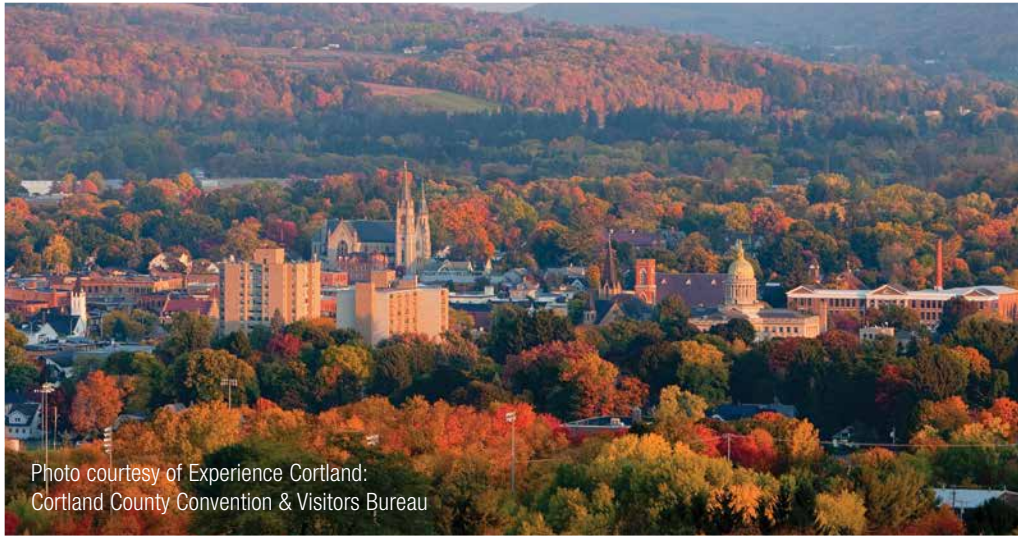

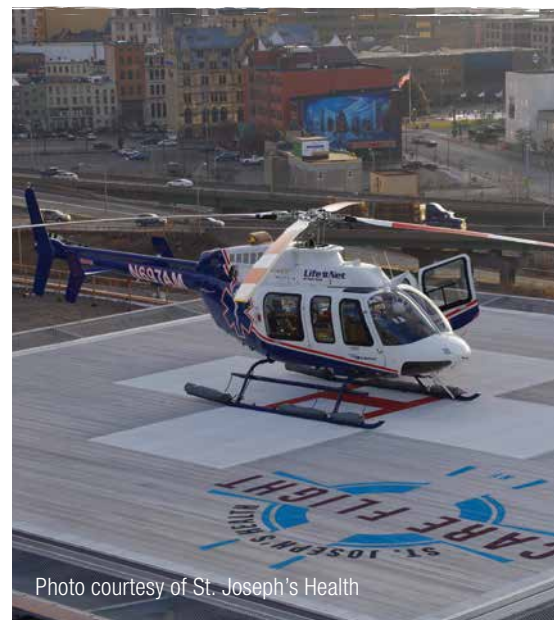

The Syracuse metropolitan area is home to more than 1,600 hospital beds at four large health care organizations: Crouse Health, St. Joseph's Health, Upstate University Hospital of the State University of New York, and the Syracuse VA Medical Center. It also includes more than 2,000 general and specialty practicing physicians, 11 nursing homes and several ambulatory care facilities.

Crouse Health is a top 10 area employer, with 3,200 employees and a medical staff of more than 900 physicians. Crouse is Central New York's largest provider of maternity care services and is the designated regional referral center for high-risk neonatal intensive care (NICU) services. CENTRAL NEW YORK HEALTH CARE QUICK FACTS

Same-day radiation for breast cancer:

Upstate University Hospital is the first hospital in the region to offer intraoperative radiation therapy, which is the delivery of radiation during surgery to remove breast cancer. The innovative procedure can reduce radiation treatments — and trips to the hospital — from 15 to 20 to just one, at the same time as surgery.

Liver transplant clinic: The University of Rochester Medical Center has opened an ambulatory clinic site at St. Joseph's Health, which will offer care closer to home for hundreds of liver transplant patients who live in Central New York and the Mohawk, Hudson Valley, Capital and Northern New York regions.

CNY Biotech Accelerator and Upstate MIND:

The Biotech Accelerator supports bioscience and medical technology and biotech entrepreneurial activity. Upstate MIND includes the Molecular Pathology Next Generation Sequencing Lab for genetic and molecular testing to predict and prevent disease.

Digital Autopsy Table: Upstate MIND features a \$100,000 machine that displays digital scans of human bodies (both alive and dead). Students use the images to explore the human anatomy without a physical cadaver and doctors can use it to plan surgeries.

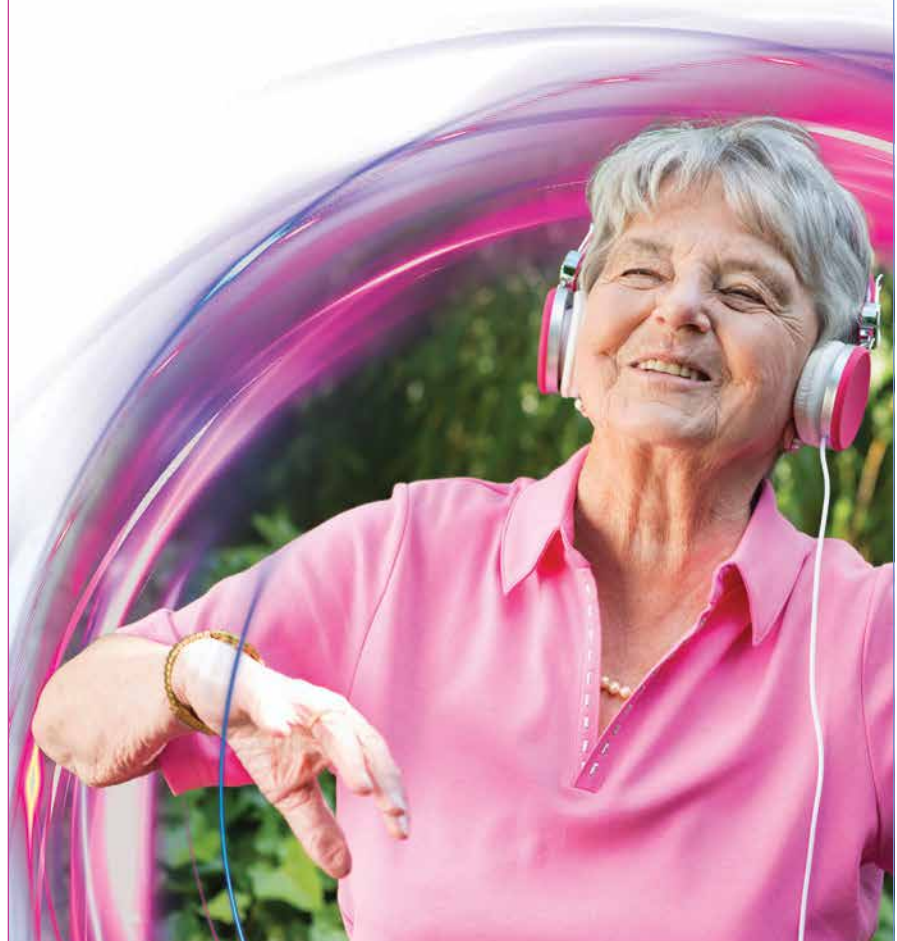
Concussion Management Program and CNY Sports Concussion Center at Upstate Medical University: Recognized by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention as a significant public health issue, this Syracuse facility is on the cutting-edge of concussion research and treatment.

Elizabeth Blackwell: The first American woman to ever earn a medical degree attended Geneva Medical College, which is now Upstate Medical University, in the late 1840s.

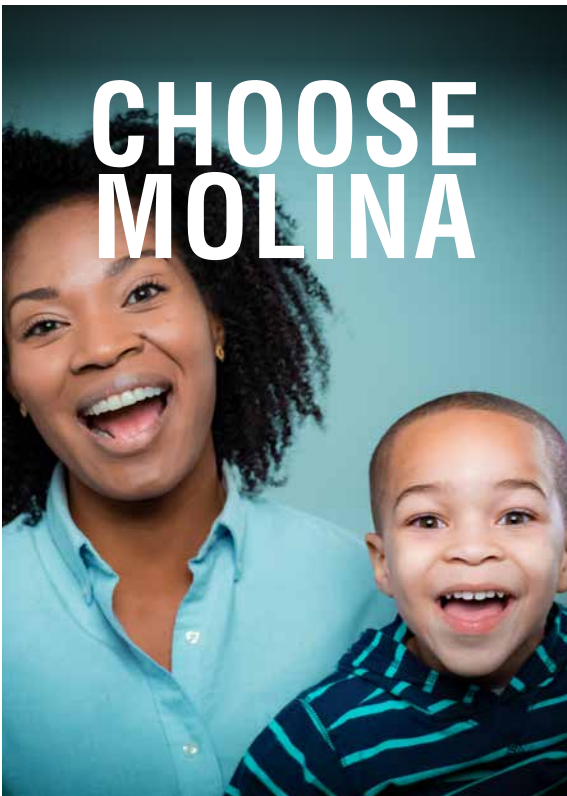

LOCAL LINGO

Brush up on names, words and landmarks to sound like a Syracuse local.

Salt City Market: Central New York is abuzz with excitement about the new Salt City Market, set to open in fall 2020 on the southwestern edge of downtown Syracuse. The market will include a food hall with stalls and merchants selling foods from around the world as well as a grocery store, cafe, bar, events and play space, plus living and working space on the upper levels.

The Amp: Officially called the St. Joseph's Health Amphitheater at Lakeview, "The Amp" is a lakeside concert venue that opened in 2015. With beautiful Onondaga Lake as a backdrop, the venue can accommodate nearly 18,000 concertgoers for country, rock, alternative and family friendly shows during the warmer months of the year.

Batu and Ajay: Undoubtedly some of the biggest Central New Yorkers there are — and also maybe the cutest, Batu and Ajay are the baby Asian elephant brothers at the Rosamond Gifford Zoo in Syracuse. Batu was born in May 2015 and Ajay (pronounced Ah-JAI and means "invincible" in Sanskrit) was born in January 2019. Visitors enjoy watching the two roughhouse under the watchful eye of their mother and grandmother in the newly renovated and expanded outdoor elephant exhibit at the zoo.

Tipp Hill: This tight-knit community on the west side of Syracuse takes great pride in its Irish heritage. Visit a local Irish restaurant, gift shop or watering hole, run the annual Shamrock Run and be sure to gaze upon the famous green-on-top traffic light. Want to visit on St. Patrick's Day? The blocks are rocking and you'll need to snag your parking spot at the top of the mornin' no matter the day of the week!

Lights on the Lake: Open from mid-November to early January each year, Lights on the Lake is a two-mile long, drive-through attraction featuring dozens of lighted holiday displays at Onondaga Lake Park in Liverpool. Some of the most popular nights on the LOTL schedule include a preview walk through, a dog-walking night and new in 2019, an early morning run through the lights. It's a fun, affordable way to stay warm and toasty while getting the whole family into the holiday spirit.

Green Lakes: Short for Green Lakes State Park, which is a pristine New York State Park in eastern Onondaga County. Its claim-to-fame are its brightly colored lakes thanks to a unique instance of fall and spring waters not mixing to dilute the colors. The park also includes miles and miles of trails, an 18-hole golf course, a restaurant, public beach, playground, boat house and campground.

Hotel Syracuse: Now officially called the Marriott Syracuse Downtown, many still refer to this gem by its original name, the Hotel Syracuse. Built in 1924, Hotel Syracuse was a hub of downtown for decades. It fell into disrepair before finally closing in 2004. Local developer Ed Riley acquired the building in 2014 and completed a \$57 million renovation before the hotel reopened for business in 2016.

M Street: Short for Marshall Street, which is just off the Syracuse University campus and home to a smattering of great food and drink options for students and game-goers. It's also where hundreds if not thousands of students took to the streets — and the trees — to celebrate the men's basketball national championship in 2003.

Congress: It's back in session in Syracuse with the re-launch of this historic local brew by Willow Rock Brewing Company. The Haberle brewery made Congress Beer from the late 1800s until the 1960s. Willow Rock worked with the Onondaga Historical Association to use notes on the original recipe to recreate the beer.

Salt potatoes: Buy a bag of taters in the grocery store here in the summertime and you'll find a small bag of salt in the bottom. Why? Because you're in Syracuse! Once the salt capital of the world (the area was once home to huge salt springs and production companies) Syracusans learned to love their spuds boiled in salty water. The salt coats the skin, which prevents the potato from getting waterlogged. Try them at the fair or make them at home and call yourself a true Syracusan.

Syracuse: Is it pronounced like:

Deer (Seer – acuse)?

Bear (Sarah – cuse)?

Sir (Sir – acuse)?

There's lots of debate among Syracusans. What's your favorite?

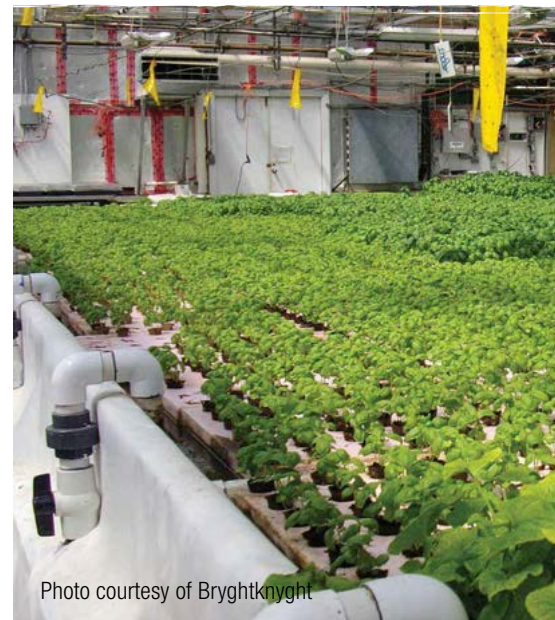

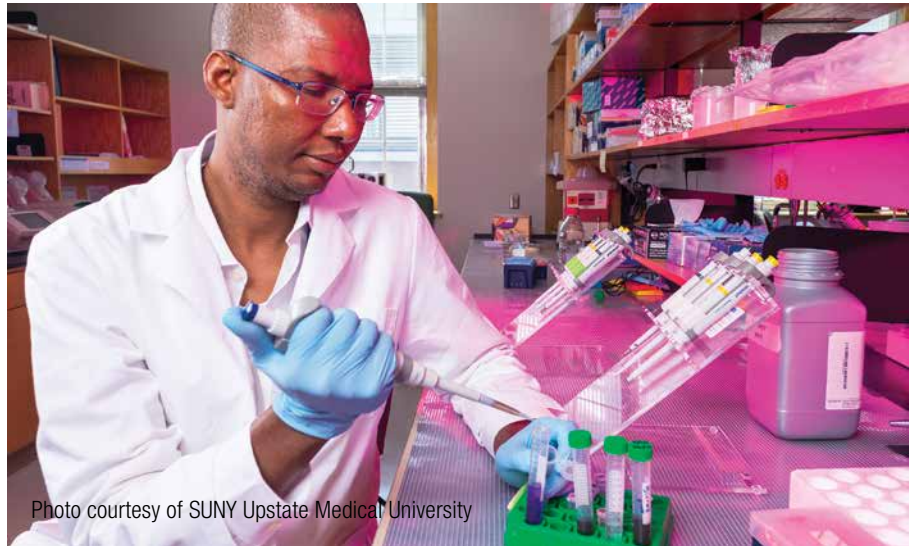


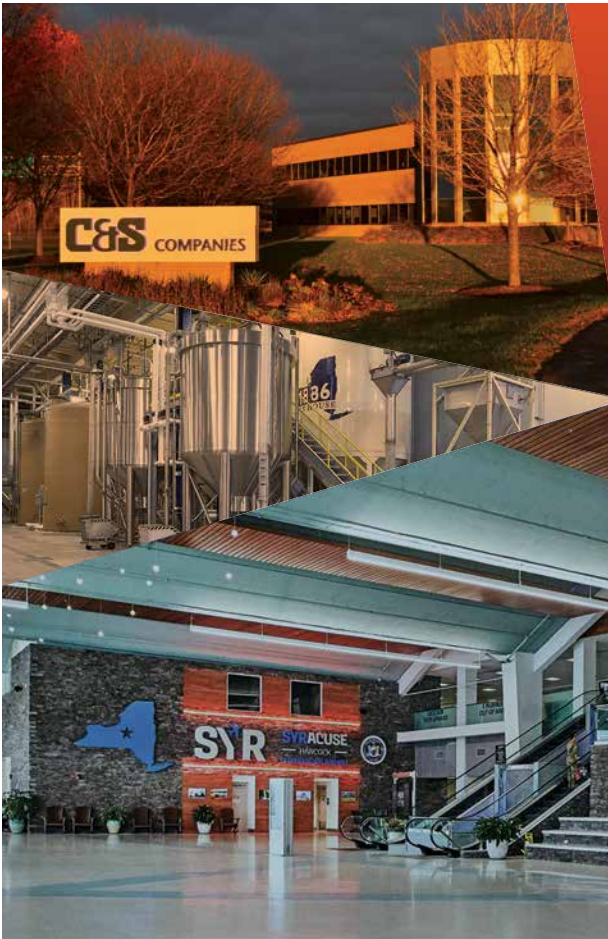

The region's strategic economic development plan, CNY Rising, offers a vision for accelerating investments in key areas of significant market opportunity, including unmanned aerial systems (UAS). The potential UAS market size is estimated to grow to approximately \$89 billion worldwide by 2022, creating a unique opportunity for domestic and foreign-owned businesses. A complete UAS ecosystem of unmatched public-private partnerships, resources for startups and businesses, and initiatives fueled by CNY Rising make this region UAS Central. www.uascentral.com

UAS CENTRAL

Central New York and the Mohawk Valley are leading the development of a corridor of innovation and testing that will take the unmanned aerial systems industry to new heights. Some of the world's best companies are already doing business here, and incentives, infrastructure and industry expertise make it a prime location to grow a UAS-related business.

Incentives/Investment - New York state is making an unprecedented investment in the development of UAS infrastructure, and providing incentives to companies relocating to the region. In addition to regular programs and resources, New York state partnered with CenterState CEO to launch the UAS Central Job Fund, providing a significant hiring incentive to catalyze industry growth. To date, Job Fund awardees will create more than 200 new, high paying jobs in Central New York — joining more than 400,000 people working in the UAS industry and supply chain.

Infrastructure & Assets - In November 2019, New York state announced completion of the world's first 50-mile unmanned traffic management corridor for beyond visual line of sight operations. The corridor complements the FAA-designated UAS test site headquartered at Griffiss International Airport, one of just seven in the country, which offers a world-class facility and diverse airspace to test UAS applications. The Griffiss Business & Technology Park has attained national recognition for transforming a former Air Force installation into a vibrant business and technology park and is now home to more than 75 businesses and 5,700 employees.

Industry Expertise - With the region's industrial roots in the aerospace industry, decades of DOD and military aviation heritage, private sector experience and expertise in sensing technologies, our executives, professionals and support resources are among the best in the industry.

STARTUPS

The UAS startup ecosystem includes university research, incubators, and the world's largest business accelerator for unmanned systems — GENIUS NY. GENIUS NY is focused on unmanned systems: software, hardware, analytics and IoT. The year-long, in-residence program awards five finalist teams a total of \$3 million in investment. The program provides UAS startups all the tools they need for success, including stipends, resources, programming and connections. www.geniusny.com

INDUSTRY PARTNERS

Our private sector, government, academic and NGO partners are all critical to building a UAS ecosystem primed for business growth. Some of the best in the UAS industry come together in New York, including NASA, FAA, and Association for Unmanned Vehicle Systems International.

NUAIR Alliance - a New York-based nonprofit coalition of more than 200 private and public entities and academic institutions working together to operate and oversee UAS test ranges in New York, Massachusetts and Michigan.

ASPI - Syracuse University's Autonomous Systems Policy Institute is an interdisciplinary effort to advance knowledge and teaching in the field of autonomous systems by exploring new frontiers in policy, law and governance of these fast expanding technologies.

Corporate Partners - some of the industry's strongest companies, including Lockheed Martin, Saab, SRC, AIS, Unify, Northeast Information Discovery, Thales, AirMap, Microdrones and MOOG, already do business here and use the region's resources and FAA-approved test site.

INVENTIONS WITH CNY TIES

Traffic signals: The Crouse-Hinds Electric Company was founded in Syracuse in 1897. They specialized in high-grade electrical specialties and were the first to manufacture traffic signals.

Literacy organization: Literacy Volunteers of America, the country's first nonprofit focusing on adult literacy, was founded by Ruth Johnson Colvin, of Syracuse, in 1962.

Plank road: The first plank road in the United States was built in North Syracuse to transport salt and other goods.

Ferris wheel: The first Ferris wheel was built in Syracuse for the New York State Fair. It had four cars that could hold 20 people and was rotated by hand.

Air-cooled engine: Designed for the Franklin automobile, the first air-cooled engine was manufactured in Syracuse in 1902. It now lives in the Smithsonian Institution.

Penicillin: Bristol Laboratories (now Bristol-Myers Squibb) manufactured the first synthetic penicillin here in 1959.

Drive-in bank window: The first customer to drive up to a bank and do business did it in Syracuse when Merchant's Bank opened the first drive-in bank window here in 1941.

Pacemaker: The modern pacemaker was advanced by engineer and inventor Wilson Greatbatch, who hailed from Buffalo and graduated from Cornell University.

Shot clock: The owners of the Syracuse Nationals basketball team invented the shot clock in 1954 to quicken the game and attract more fans.

In November 2019, Microsoft, the city of Syracuse, Onondaga County, and Syracuse University's iSchool announced an innovative collaboration that will include exploration of a tech hub, partnering with education providers and community organizations on digital literacy and workforce training, the idea of an innovation summit and support for research in Artificial Intelligence (AI) to grow long-term opportunities for residents and a leading-edge role for Syracuse in that arena. It also looks at how to support continued development of an entrepreneurial and innovation ecosystem to help establish/grow new startups and innovation jobs, as well as support for digital transformation efforts for local businesses. The goal is to more rapidly advance Syracuse Surge, the community's strategy of inclusive growth in the New Economy. The city of Syracuse, Onondaga County and Syracuse University will provide local leadership to the collaboration and will actively recruit other institutions and organizations to partner in the programs.

Syracuse Surge is a newly formed initiative dedicated to driving inclusive growth in the New Economy. At the heart of Surge is an unprecedented series of investments in tech infrastructure that will position Syracuse as one of America's "smartest" cities and a global leader in the New Economy. Surge was initiated by the city of Syracuse, who in collaboration with Onondaga County and leading local institutions, is working with New York state to advance Surge to translate imminent economic growth into shared prosperity among all residents. CenterState CEO is a critical partner in the Surge initiative, particularly in creating workforce solutions, small business development opportunities, and connecting regional businesses with a wide range of tech related industries.

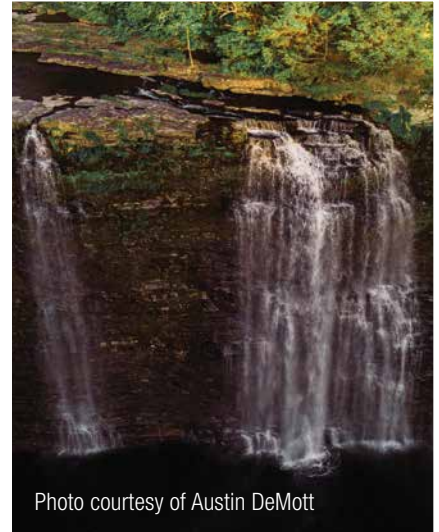

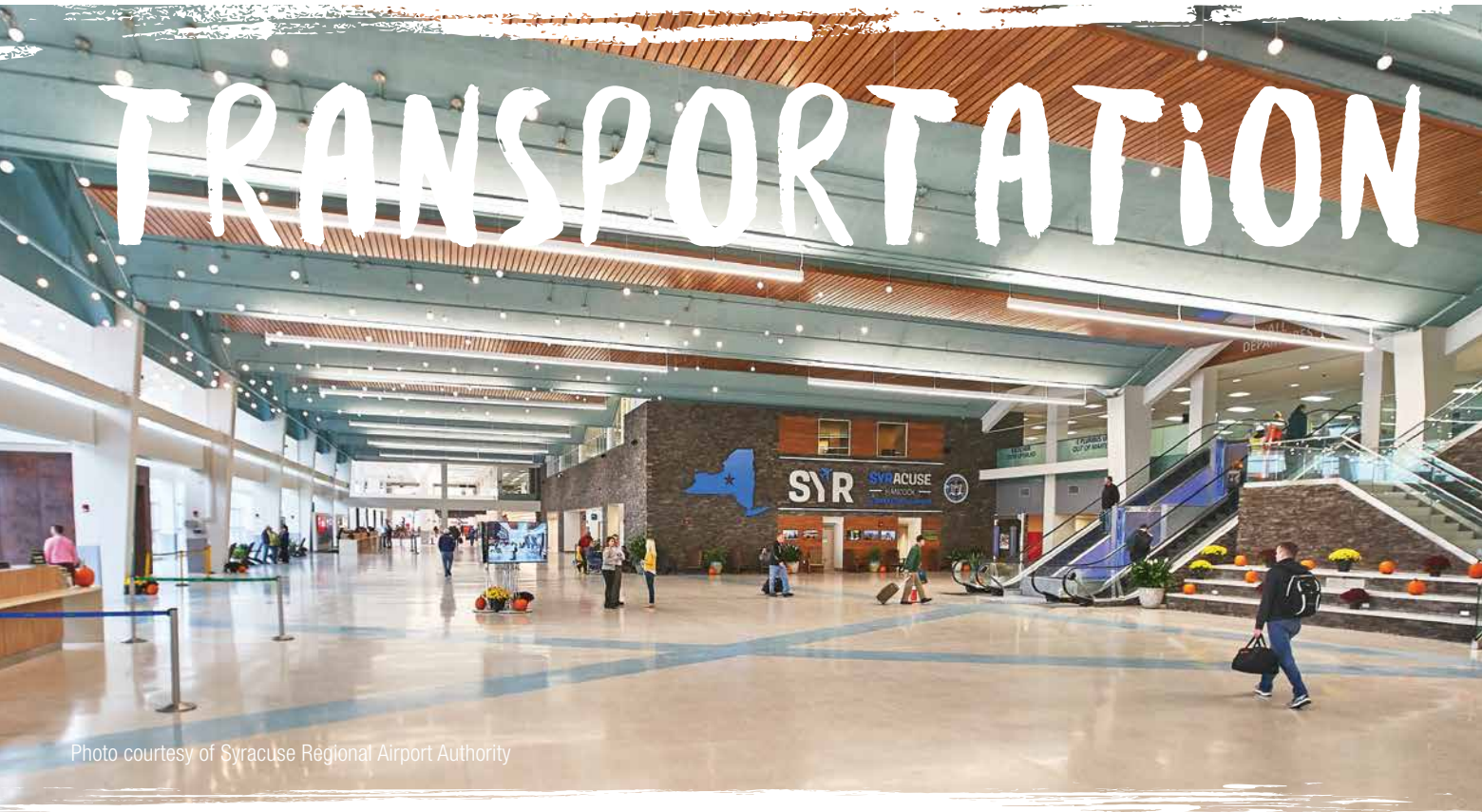

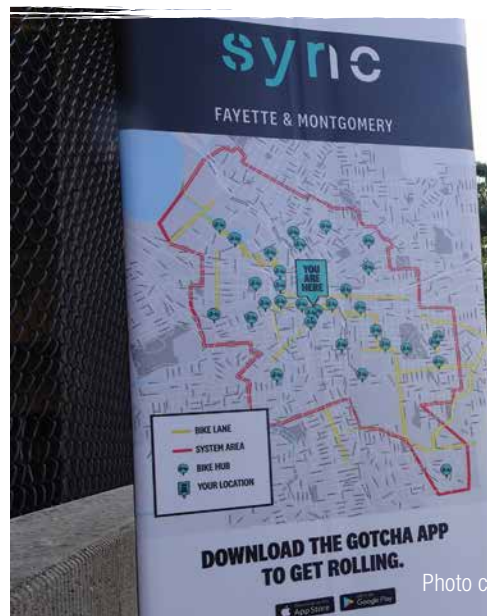
